The Salem Boy's chorus will give their first public concert of the season Sunday evening at the First Christian church.

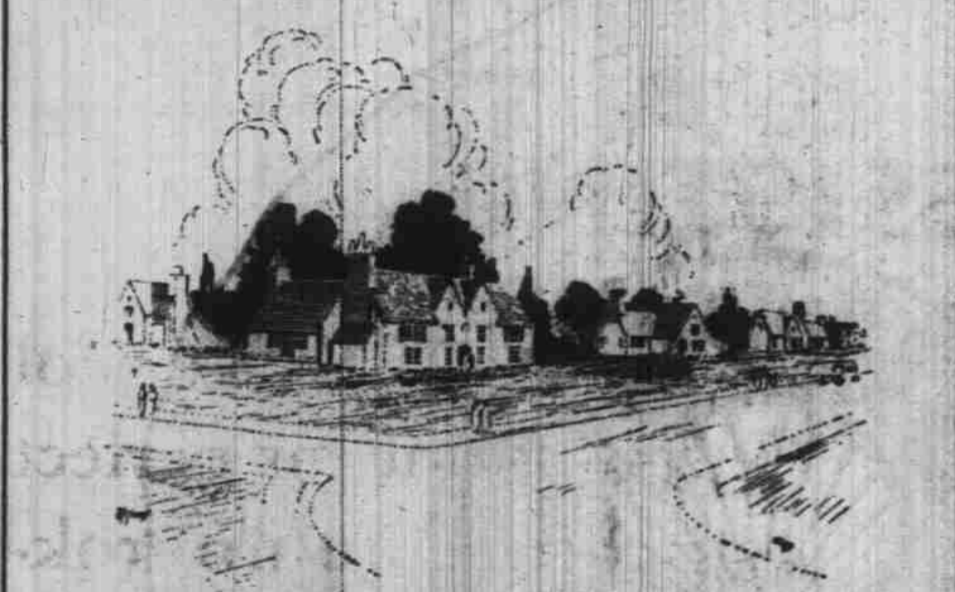
A Near East representative will be on hand to make a ten minute talk and outside of this feature, the entire evening will be devoted to the concert.

The men are scheduled to return here Monday and to close their season with a single debate with Lawrence College, to be held in the Waller Hall chapel April 8.

Patriot's Day Pamphlet Is Mailed By Churchill

Teachers of the state are receiving a suggested program for Patriot's day, which is to be observed throughout Oregon on the 150th anniversary of the battle of Lexington and Concord, from J. A. Churchill, state superintendent of public instruction.

Since April 19, the anniversary of the battle, falls on Sunday, the schools will observe the date on Monday. The program contains Governor Pierce's proclamation, patriotic poems, songs and readings.

"Patriot's day should commemorate not only the anniversary of the battle of Lexington and Concord, but should afford an opportunity to rehearse the causes which led up to the American Revolutionary war," according to the pamphlet.
