ALBANY DEBATEERS DEFEAT BEARCATS

Willamette Freshmen Squad Loses Last Night by 3 to 0

ALBANY, Or., April 15.—(Special to the Statesman.)—The Albany college freshmen defeated Willamette university freshmen intercollegiate debate team by a 3-0 decision in an interesting debate held on the local floor this evening.

The debate was closely contested throughout although the Willamette team were unable to overcome the passionate oratory presented by Miss Joan Buchanan, second Albany speaker. Albany was represented by Miss Katherine Pratt and Miss Jean Buchanan, and they were met by William McAllister and Earl Pemberton. The judges were Earl Payne, editor of the Albany Democrat, Rev. Tucker of the Christian church, and Mr. Lewellyn district attorney, and a graduate of the Willamette law school. Miss Schewin, head of the Albany college English department, was chairman of the evening.

Woman Arrested on Liquor Charge; Conspiracy Held SAN FRANCISCO, April 15.—Mrs. Erna Brown, formerly of Seattle, the sister of Ariel and Milo Eggers, principals in an alleged bootleg plot, was arrested here today by a federal official on a charge of conspiring to effect the release of a federal prisoner. Mrs. Brown was unable to furnish bail of \$5,000 and was remanded to the county jail. Her attorney said he will ask the United States district court tomorrow to reduce the bail on the representation that Mrs. Brown will remain here and be prepared to surrender into custody whenever her presence is wanted by the government.

British Schooner Captured Off East Coast; Large Cargo Liquor Seized NEW YORK, April 15.—Uncle Sam's rum chasers Tuesday added \$250,000 to the value of recent liquor seizures in this vicinity with the capture of the two-masted British 95-ton auxiliary schooner, Madeline Adams, 20 miles off the coast. There was some mystery about the capture of the trim little craft which had in her hold 3700 cases of assorted liquors, including champagnes, in addition to 100 barrels of alcohol on her decks. Capt. W. E. V. Jacobs, commandant of the New York division of the coast guard, assured questioners that the schooner was taken "20 miles off Fire Island." But the fact that the coast guard cutter Seminole spent 12 hours in the chase led to reports that the pursuit took the speedy boat from 150 to 200 miles out to sea and that a number of shots were laid across the fugitive's bows before the capture. The capture was made late yesterday and the Madeline Adams tonight was anchored off the Statue of Liberty, a coast guard prize crew aboard in charge of her captain, John Gillan, and seven members of the crew.

Financing Liquor Runners Admitted Forgery of Sales Contract Confessed to by Seattle Auto Broker SEATTLE, April 15.—Forgery of approximately 30 automobile sales contracts to raise \$10,000 to finance a rum running ring was admitted today in superior court by Ray Zbinden, former vice president of the Zbinden-Dodge Motor company, Seattle. Zbinden, who pleaded guilty to getting \$300 from Seattle automobile finance brokers, received a suspended sentence of from one to 10 years in a reformatory at Monroe, Wash. In court he said his company became involved to the extent of \$6,000 two years ago. "I entered an agreement with some liquor runners to raise \$10,000 to finance the purchase of liquor in Canada and bring it to the United States," Zbinden testified. "I expected to make \$10,000 profit on the deal and put the automobile firm on its feet. To raise the money I forged approximately 30 automobile sales contracts and sold them to different runners but they said that the liquor was hi-jacked en route to Seattle. This was two years ago, I paid back about \$5,000, but still have \$6,000 to pay."
