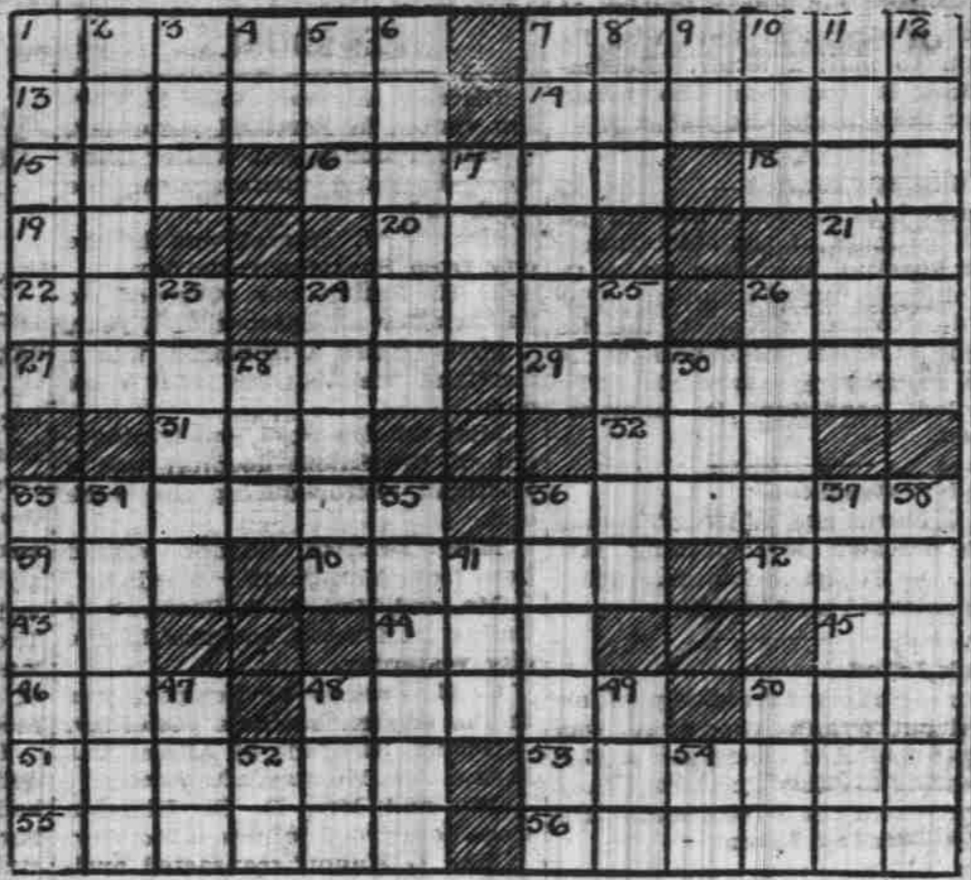

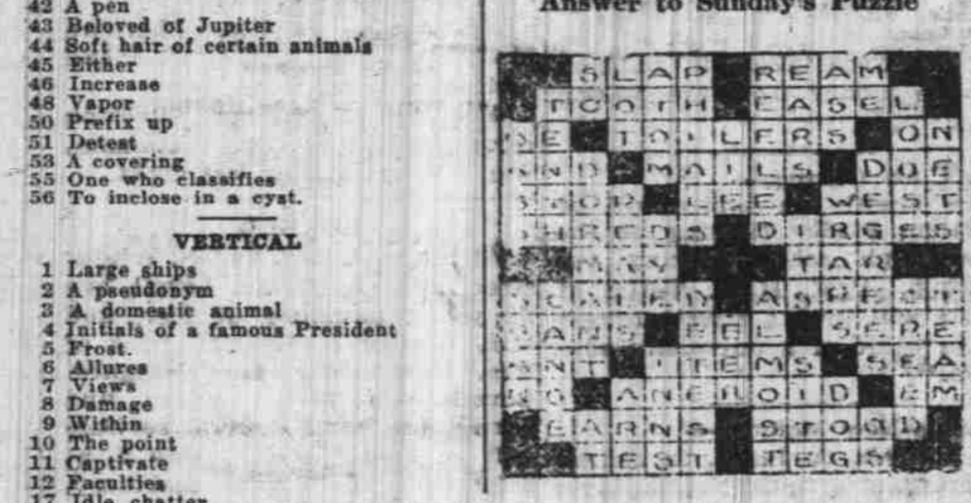

PEACE BETWEEN NATIONS. TOPIC

Former Chiefs of Navy and Army Hold Debate on Problems

WASHINGTON, May 4.—Arguments for and against military preparedness as the principal reliance for peace were presented in a radio debate tonight by former chiefs of the navy and army general staffs.

Disarmament should not be resorted to, however, he added, "except as a result of an agreement between competing nations, loyally accepted and adhered to." "All armaments could be held at a reasonable minimum," continued General Bliss, sufficient for the maintenance of peace and order within the state, but insufficient to tempt a state almost without warning to attack a similarly placed neighbor.
