The Oregon Agricultural college experiment station. Many producers have adopted the plan of setting up roadside stores, or booths—a scheme which has proved especially good for the selling of honey. Signs placed along the road on both sides of the booth call the attention of motorists to the honey. TEXAS AND OREGON UNITE IN SERVING
Lone Star Service Station Extends Texas Greeting to Oregon
Out on North Capitol street you will find a service station with the sign "Lone Star." Across the street is the "Texas Garage." Back of the service station is a beautiful dwelling with a "Lone Star" worked into the brick of the chimney.

John Williamson, and family, formerly of Texas, live there and are contributing wonderfully to the development of a beautiful section of Salem. 30 new cottages are being added to the 10 already there in the "Lone Star" camp ground. These grounds will represent an investment of \$25,000. The cottages have all modern conveniences, open night and day, police protection at all times. The new ones will be 3-room apartments. 50 full grown cherry trees are in the camp grounds—free cherries to campers. A new stucco store building of Spanish design to harmonize with the rest of the buildings of "Williamsonville," will be open day and night, where drinks, ice cream, confectionery and lunches will be served. A block north and across the street Mr. Williamson is erecting another service station with 5 pumps, water and air service, 15,000 square feet of cement floor. Here he will have his offices in two large rooms. Mr. Williamson says he plans making this the finest service station in Oregon.

His Texas garage is across from the Lone Star station. It is now under the management of the Barrett Brothers, two first class mechanics who guarantee all work and give a 24 hour service. A bank and a postoffice are among the Williamson plans for the near future.

POWDERY MILDEW IN ROSES
Powdery mildew is the cause of much damage to roses in Oregon. The climbing roses are more susceptible to injury than the other roses. Starting early in the spring and dusting with the finest grade of dusting sulfur at two week intervals is recommended by the Oregon Agricultural college experimental station. FARM REMINDERS FROM THE COLLEGE
Forcing Growth of Pigs, Gypsum for Meadows, the Black Raspberry, Etc., Etc.

Top dressings of gypsum on the meadow at this time will greatly increase the coming hay crop. Broadcast at the rate of 100 pounds per acre is the usual application. It is often advisable to leave a strip untreated in order to compare the benefits of the gypsum application, says the Oregon Agricultural college experiment station.
