

**QUAKE ROCKS JAPAN CITY**

**DAMAGE NOT REPORTED**

OSAKA, Japan, May 23—(By The Associated Press)—A severe earthquake occurred at 11:06 this morning. It centered in the Tajima district, 80 miles northwest of Osaka. The town of Toyo-Oka is reported badly damaged. There was no damage in Osaka. Tokyo and Yokohama were not affected. The greatest damage is believed to have been done in Tajima district although the shock felt west of Osaka was the severest that has occurred in years. It is reported that 200 houses collapsed at Toyo-Oka. There were numerous fires. The railroads and telegraphs to the north coast are interrupted. There has been no report thus far of the number of casualties.

A relief train has been sent to Toyo-Oka.

have been well-informed upon the subject.

Physicians are Present  
An unusually large number of physicians and surgeons were present, beside Dr. R. L. Edwards, prison physician and Dr. William B. Mott, city health officer. These included Dr. T. M. Manner of Seattle, representing Judge Kendall, of Coos county; Dr. Earl V. Morrow and Dr. Earl Smith, both of Portland. Ben Fisher, Coos county district attorney and representatives of the sheriff's office were also present in addition to newspapermen.

Peare was hanged for the murder of his wife and a neighbor, James Culver, near Myrtle Point, December, 27, 1922 and Covell for inciting the death of his sister-in-law, Mrs. Ebba Covell, near Bandon, September 3, 1923.

Since capital punishment was inaugurated in 1903, with a brief intermission of several years, 33 men have been hanged; 14 received commuted sentences; 1 received a reversal of the case. Another man, sentenced several months ago, is awaiting re-trial in eastern Oregon.
