### AUSTRIAN JOINS STAFF DR. LEONHARTSBERGER HERE FOR DEMONSTRATION

Dr. Hans Leonhartsberger, an officer of the Austrian army during the World war and engaged in public health service at Vienna, Austria, has taken up work in connection with the Marion county health demonstration, it was announced Thursday.

He is the only Austrian doctor in the United States under the auspices of the Commonwealth fund, who recently established two health centers in Austria. He has been in this country since the first of the year. Dr. Leonhartsberger will sail for home August 15, leaving from New York. During the war Dr. Leonharts-

berger was assigned to an infantry battalion on the Russian front in a medical capacity. The Austrian army, he declares, has now been reduced to 30,000 men. Dr. Leonhartsberger is much impressed with the Salem district which has been a revelation as to the prosperity of the farmers. He stated that the scenery of the state is also a source of wonder, particularly that around Mt. Hood.

### 2 Killed, 16 Hurt When Train Crashes at Forks

KENTON, Ohio, June 18.—Two persons were instantly killed and 16 injured when a Big Four passenger train struck an open siding and left the track at Grant, Ohio, 10 miles north of Kenton, at 4:45 p. m. today. C. C. Woodward, Toledo, a train news "butcher" and an unidentified man were killed. The engine and three coaches were derailed. Both the engineer and fireman were severely injured, according to reports. The train attains a speed of 70 miles an hour at times. Relief was sent from nearby cities.

### Ted Thye Is Victorious Over Edwards in 2 Falls

PORTLAND, June 18.—Ted Thye celebrated his return from a three months' sojourn in Australia by winning a light heavyweight wrestling match from Billy Edwards of Kansas City tonight. He won two falls—the first in 42 minutes with a combination of his favorite wristlock and a hammerlock. Edwards won the second fall in 10 minutes, 30 seconds with a headlock, and Thye took the third and deciding fall in 9 minutes by lifting his opponent over his head and slamming him, on his back to the floor, where he pinned Edwards' shoulders before the Kansan could recover his breath.

### POLICEMAN IS ATTACKED

SERGEANT CURRAN IS AGAIN FIRED AT BY GANGSTERS

CHICAGO, June 19.—(By The Associated Press).—Sergeant Elbridge Curran of the state's attorney's office, early this morning reported a second attempt to shoot him, following upon the incident of Tuesday night when a man, believed to be seeking revenge for the indictment of two gangsters, fired at him in the county building and missed.

Last night, as Curran was driving home through the Italian district, two men on a street corner suddenly drew revolvers and fired four shots at him, then ran to a parked car and drove away. Two of the bullets struck Curran's car, but neither he nor his companion were hit. The officer said he was surprised by the attack and instead

of returning the fire or pursuing, drove until he met another policeman. When the three returned to the scene of the attack the car had disappeared.

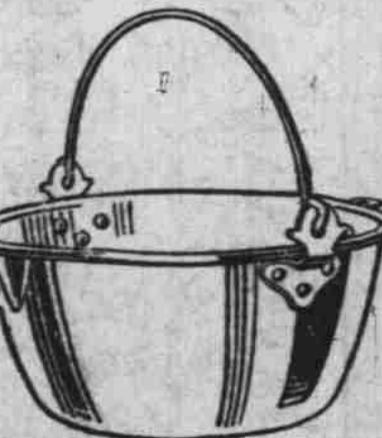
