Notice of Intention to Improve the Alley in Block 50 of City of Salem. Notice is hereby given that the Common Council of the City of Salem, Oregon, deems it necessary and expedient and hereby declares its purpose and intention to improve alley in block 50 of the original plat of the City of Salem, Marion county, Oregon, from the south line of Center street to the north line of Chemeketa street, at the expense of the abutting and adjacent property, by bringing said alley to the established grade and paving same with a six inch Portland cement concrete pavement in accordance with the plans, specifications and estimates therefor which were adopted by the Common Council June 15, 1925, now on file in the office of the city recorder and which said plans and specifications and estimates are hereby referred to and made a part of this notice.

The Common Council hereby declares its purpose and intention to make the above described improvement by and through the street improvement department of the City of Salem. Written remonstrance may be filed with the city recorder of said city against the above proposed improvement within ten days from date of final publication hereof. Separate sealed proposals for furnishing labor and materials required for the full completion of plumbing, heating and the general construction of Ward Building No. 3 for the Eastern Oregon State Hospital located about 1 1/2 miles west of Pendleton, Oregon, will be opened by the Oregon State Board of Control at the Capitol building, Salem, Oregon, at 2 p. m. July 6, 1925.
