

AUTOMOBILE OWNER IS WARNED OF LAW

Certificate of Title to Machine Is Now Compulsory Under Statute

Registration of Motor Vehicles, Issuance of Licenses to be Denied Until Law is Obeyed

No certificate of registration of any motor vehicle or number plates, therefore whether original issues or duplicates, will be issued by the Secretary of State after July 1, unless the applicant shall at the same time he applies for a motor vehicle license make application for and be granted an official certificate of title to such machine, or shall furnish satisfactory evidence that such a certificate has been previously issued.

This was announced here this week by Sam A. Koser, secretary of state, in connection with the administration of the so-called motor vehicle title of registration law enacted at the last session of the legislature. The law becomes effective on July 1.

"This law," reads a letter prepared by the secretary of state for the consideration of sheriffs, "has a vital bearing upon motor vehicle licenses to be issued after July 1.

"Forms for convenience of motor vehicle owners in applying for certificates of title are now being prepared by the secretary of state and will be furnished to motor vehicle owners upon request.

"The subject matter of this letter is of great importance to every motor vehicle owner who may desire a motor vehicle license on or after July 1, and you are therefore especially urged to bring to their attention the provisions of the certificate of title law (chapter 250, laws 1925). For the convenience of all motor vehicle owners who have registered their cars prior to this date, or who may register their cars and receive their licenses before July 1, application blanks for applying for certificates of title will be mailed them within the next few weeks.

"The certificate of title law requires that the owners of every motor vehicle, whether or not the car has been registered and licensed before July 1, shall immediately apply for a certificate of title and furnish the secretary of state satisfactory evidence of ownership before such certificate of title can be issued by the secretary of state."

FORD OUTPUT IS LARGE

TOTAL OF TRUCKS AND CARS IS ABOVE 8,125 DAILY

World production of Ford cars and trucks is now averaging slightly above 8,125 a day, a daily output greater than at any previous time in the history of the Ford organization.

This is the astonishing record of Ford accomplishments revealed in figures just given out at the general offices in Detroit covering the combined production of domestic assembly plants, foreign plants and associated companies and the Ford Motor Company of Canada, Ltd. It is not only significant as indicating the growth of the automobile industry both here and abroad, but it presents the world-wide acceptance of motor car transportation, for while domestic plants of the company have for the last few weeks been setting new production records, foreign plants also have attained to new marks.

Since the first of May the Ford assembly plants in the United States have been averaging a daily output of more than 7,000 cars and trucks and this in the face of several days when operations at one or more plants were more or less curtailed due to delays in arrival of parts.

No mechanical adjustments had to be made during the course of the race. The car made an average of 43.88 ton miles per gallon. The run, as usual, was conducted under A. A. supervision and a most careful inspection of all models was made to make certain that every model was a strictly stock car.

Four sweepstakes victories, two close car sweepstakes victories and six class championships give Oakland an enviable record for economical operation.

These victories were won in the Camp Curry Yosemite runs in 1922, 1923, '24 and 1925 and the San Diego to El Centro and return economy runs in 1922 and 1923.

VANCOUVER PAGEANT WILL LINK TWO NATIONS

AMERICANS AND CANADIANS TO PARTICIPATE IN GAMES

Sports, Pageants, and Social Events Scheduled for Four Day Period

Expressing the company's strong support of closer relations between the United States and Canada, posters advertising the Grand Canadian International celebration to be held at Vancouver, July 1 to 4, are being prominently displayed in all service stations of the Union Oil company of California from the Mexican line to British Columbia, it was learned here today.

CONCRETE SAID CHEAPER

COST OF DRIVING CAR ON CONCRETE DECLARED LESS

The General Tire company of Springfield, Ill., engaged some time ago in the "Hire A Car and Drive It Yourself" business, and established a most thorough cost-finding system. Certain cars were confined to trips on concrete roads, and others to earth road trips. After 12,600 miles of running it was found that the average expense for cars sent over concrete roads had been \$288 less than for machines run over dirt, taking into account gasoline, oil, tires, repairs, depreciation, interest on investment, cleaning and garage space. Operating costs were as follows:

Ford touring—Cost per mile on earth roads, \$0.993, cost per mile on concrete roads, \$0.669; Ford coupe, earth roads, .94, concrete roads, .670; Ford sedan, earth roads, .895, concrete roads, .672; Dodge touring, earth roads, .115, concrete roads, .691.

These figures show a saving of 2.4 cents a car for all classes of machines on each mile traveled. This is approximately 25 per cent, and in the case of low priced cars would soon pay for a new one.

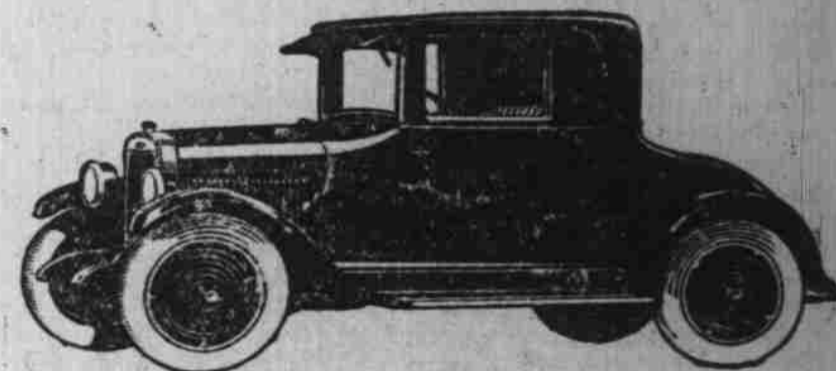

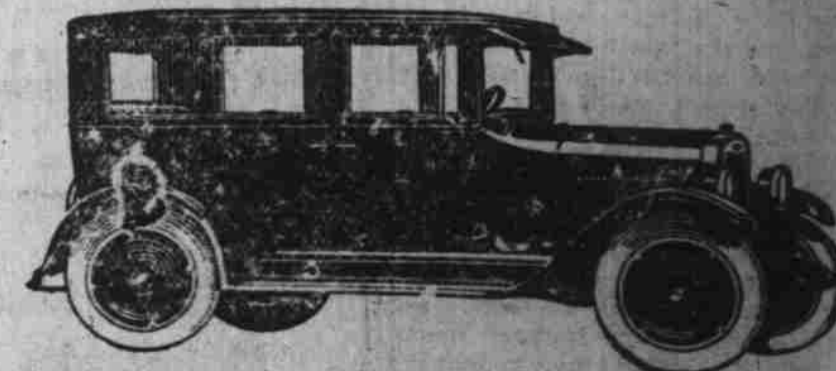
