electric cars which run in straight lines, must do likewise. It also teaches the old lesson that the slower moving vehicles must either be kept off certain streets or else be required to hug the

Parking time must be graded. When limited to 30 minutes it is possible to park about four times as many vehicles than when parking time is unlimited.

Students of traffic are of the opinion that many of our leading cities are not handling more than 25 per cent of the number of vehicles they could under scientific control.


