

**CHRISTIAN ENDEAVORS  
GATHER IN PORTLAND**

**TWENTY SPECIAL TRAINS ARE  
DUE BY SATURDAY**

Delegates Coming to National Session from All Parts of United States.

PORTLAND, Ore., July 1.—(A. P.)—Twenty special trains are headed toward this city with thousands of Christian Endeavorers from all parts of the United States and Canada, who will spend from July 4 to 10 attending the 30th International Christian Endeavor convention.

Edward P. Gates of Boston, general secretary, anticipates a registration of 15,000 delegates. Approximately 12,000 registrations were recorded at the last international convention held two years ago at Des Moines. The growth of the movement during the last two years and increased enthusiasm on the part of constituent groups are responsible for the increased registration, he said.

Gifford Pinchot, governor of Pennsylvania will give the opening address on "Conservation of America's Ideals." Because of July 4 being the nation's birthday, the theme of the session will be "Christian Citizenship." The Rev. Dr. Francis E. Clark, familiarly known as "Father Endeavor" Clark, who founded the movement 44 years ago in Portland, Me., will preside at the opening session. During the convention Dr. Clark will give an address on "From Portland, Maine in 1881, to Portland, Oregon, in 1925," in which he will briefly review the history of the movement from its inception to its present active membership of approximately 4,000,000.

Among other speakers are the Rev. Dr. Daniel A. Poling of New York, the Rev. Dr. Mark A. Mathews of Seattle, the Rev. Dr. A. Ray Petty and Harry Holmes, N. York; the Rev. Dr. James Kelly of England, president of the European Christian Endeavor Union; the Rev. Dr. William Hiram Foulkes of Cleveland; the Rev. E. O. Marsden of Alaska; the Rev. Seizo Abe and the Rev. Seijiro Vemura of Japan; the Rev. George H. Hubbard of Foochow, China, and the Rev. J. Christy Wilson of Persia.

Among the conference leaders are Clarence C. Hamilton, A. J. Shurtle and the Rev. Stanley B. Vandersall, who with Mr. Gates share the responsibility for the conduct of the worldwide organization whose motto is "For Christ and the Church."

**WORLD PEACE PROBLEM

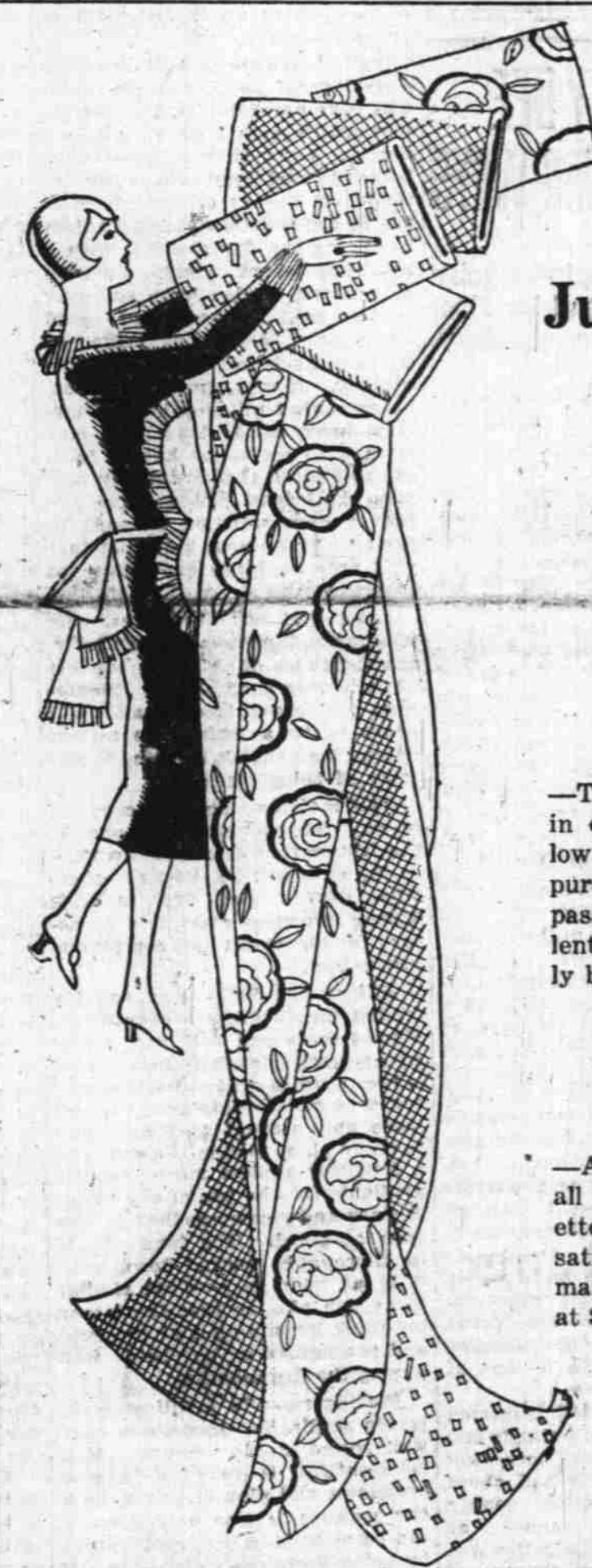
