Silverton

SILVERTON, Or., July 28. - (Special to The Statesman.) - Persons driving into Silverton from west and southwest are inclined at present to find fault with the present betterment of roads plan. Early last week the main street over the west hill was scarified preparatory to paving in the near future. After scarifying nothing more was done and drivers are forced to go over the hill as it is or by a round-about street which in the course of passage seems to be made entirely of holes and ruts. Passing of two cars on this street is very difficult and much can be said for the driver who travels either street without loss of temper when meeting another vehicle.

Drivers on the Brush Creek road are having their difficulties also as the part of the road from the railroad crossing in to city limits was scarified Monday. As there is no other road or street, choice must be made of the bumps at the side of the road or those in the road itself.

Mrs. Fred Krug who has been sick with whooping cough is reported as being much better now. Whooping cough has been prevalent at Silverton for several weeks and does not seem to be on the wane just yet. Children have for the most part been the victims of the disease but older persons have not all been immune.

Mrs. Harris was born in Illinois and died in Salem at the home of her mother, Mrs. C. L. Johnson. The Harris family lived near Silverton for about 10 years and moved to Woodburn a year or two ago.

They have made their home here for about a year but are returning because of the poor health of Mr. Jacobsen. Mrs. Jacobsen's mother, Mrs. Johnnison, and Martin and Lynne Johnnison who have been making their home with the Jacobsens are moving into the M. C. Thompson house a few miles west of Silverton.
