A sherbet is a water ice, with the addition of either egg white or gelatin. When a water ice is half frozen stir in from one to four stiffly beaten egg whites. The proportions for water ice are, one quart water, two cups sugar, three fourths to one cup fruit juice or pulp. Boil sugar and water together, add flavoring. cool, strain and freeze.

You will find the crumbs stick just as well as if egg had been used. Save eggs by mixing a little undiluted milk in raw hamburger and pork sausage cakes. 
