AN APPEAL FOR THE LEPER

Governor General Leonard Wood of the Philippines Makes an Appeal to the Great Heart of the American People

(Governor General Leonard Wood has sent to The Statesman, and presumably to the American newspapers generally, the following appeal, asking that it be given as much publicity as the managing editors may feel justified in giving.

"Throughout the world today there is deep and widespread interest in the treatment and care of leprosy. England has organized the British Empire Antileprosy society and is making arrangements for a widespread effective campaign against this dread disease in India and elsewhere.

"The results are most encouraging. We have already 449 negatives and several hundred more in sight. 75 per cent of the cases under treatment are improved and 196 have been returned to their homes as cured.

"I believe we are on the verge of great results in the treatment and care of leprosy, but we need help. We are working not only for the lepers here but for lepers all over the world and our success will be theirs as well.

"We are now carrying on this great campaign for the control and eradication of leprosy. We need your help. The American people have ever been generous in supporting movements of this kind, and I again appeal to their generosity and spirit of service in behalf of these stricken people, who are the most unfortunate and afflicted of God's creatures.

"Contributions may be made to the Chief of the Bureau of Insular Affairs, War Department, Washington, D. C. They will be transmitted to the Philippine islands and spent under the direction of the governor general."
