SALEM A GROWING LIVE STOCK CENTER

The Salem district will prosper greatest from the greatest diversity and the highest intensifying of agriculture; producing on the land the crops and breeding along the lines best adapted to our natural conditions—following the lines of least resistance—

Doing what we can do best or at greatest profit; taking advantage of the fact that this is the land of diversity and the country of opportunity.

Live stock breeding has always gone with the best farming methods. Mixed farming and gardening make for the most certain and even periods of prosperity over long stretches of time. This kind of farming keeps up and improves the fertility of the soil. It means proper rotations. It means the putting back of the elements of the soil of which they are exhausted by the crops taken off. It means the periodical growing of legumes, which extract fertility from the air and fix it in the earth for the use of future crops; it means the production on the farms of the best fertilizers, at the lowest cost.

The Salem district should raise still more cattle and hogs and sheep and goats and horses and poultry.

Ours is the greatest dairying country in the world; we produce the best cows in the world; and "baby beef" and other beef goes along with dairying, and the cow is the wet nurse of the hog and the poultry; and the ensilage that is needed for the dairy stock is good for all the rest of the live stock, as is most of the other feed needed in the dairy—

And this all goes for soil fertility and renovation. The most productive soils in the world have been the longest under continuous cultivation; and the same possibilities are found here in the Salem district, with the up to date handling of live stock along with the other uses of the soil.

Salem's packing plant, owned and operated by the Valley Packing company, a strictly home concern, has a capacity of 1000 hogs a week, besides 250 to 300 sheep, cattle and veal. The Valley Packing company pays all the time the highest prices for hogs in the United States, considering the expense of getting hogs from this district to other markets.

The fact that the producers of the Salem district receive the best prices in the country for their hogs accounts in part for the fact that Marion is the leading hog country in Ore-

gon. But there is room for vast expansion yet; as creditable as has been the growth in recent years.

There should be more pig clubs, lamb clubs and calf clubs organized in the Salem district; more and more of them—and the live stock industry should be pushed in every possible way. It will mean the building up here of the most uniformly prosperous and contented people in the wide world.

We are doing very well in the Salem district in expanding and improving the live stock industry. We have the greatest corn county in the Pacific Northwest, in Marion county, with Polk a close second, and all the adjoining valley counties getting to the front. We are fast becoming an alfalfa district—Grimm alfalfa. We are growing as a dairying district. We have the best cows on earth; the best Angora goats; some of the finest sheep—

And we are now on the point of getting beet sugar factories, which will give the live stock industry, and dairying and the poultry industry, and allied industries, the greatest impetus that could be had from any one source. Sugar beet growing will renovate the soil. It will help clean it up and build it up. The by-products, the tops, the pulp and the molasses, will help more than any other one thing could do in boosting the live stock industry in all its branches, and all the activities directly or indirectly connected therewith.

SEPARATION IS DENIED

VALENTINOS DECLARE PER-SINISTOR RUMOR UNFOUNDED

HOLLYWOOD, Aug. 19.—(By Associated Press.)—Reports that Rudolph Valentino and his wife, the former Winifred Hudnut, have separated have been denied repeatedly by the screen couple. Their latest denial was when Mrs. Valentino left here for the east a few days ago.

On that occasion the husband and wife demonstrated their affection on the station platform and posed for a "kiss picture," while they branded all separation rumors as false.

An effort was being made to-night to reach Valentino for comment on the reported statement of his wife's manager in New York that separation was an accomplished fact.

NEW YORK, Aug. 20.—(By Associated Press.)—Today's New York American says that Rudolph Valentino, original "sheik" of the screen, and his wife, Winifred De Wolfe Hudnut Valentino, have separated. The paper quotes George Elliman, manager for Mrs. Valentino, as describing an amicable arrangement for parting.

BANKING CASE IS HEARD

Declaring that the legislature, in drawing up the banking statutes, intended that the state banking headquarters should remain in Salem and not be brought to Portland, as Frank C. Bramwell, state superintendent of banks has done, Judge G. H. Skipworth gave his opinion yesterday on the case pending against Bramwell.
