

### DEER HUNTERS ARE AWAITING SEASON

Weather Conditions Said Almost Ideal; Season to Open September 6

Weather conditions prior to the opening of the deer hunting season, September 10 are the nearest to ideal this year than they have been for several seasons, according to local hunters and sporting goods store men. The rain has cut down the forest fires and eliminated much of the fire hazards. At the same time it has dampened the underbrush and dry, crackling twigs that give the deer warning of the hunters' approach are not feared this season. The first party to set a date for departure consists of W. C. Winslow, W. H. Trindle and George Vick, who have hunted together for years.

The state is divided into two districts, No. 1 comprising all counties west of the summit of the Cascade mountains and No. 2 all those to the east of the summit. Two male deer with horns during the season is the limit. The season closes October 20.

Other open seasons on game in this district, comprised of Clatsop, Columbia, Tillamook, Washington, Benton, Multnomah, Yamhill, Clackamas, Lincoln, Polk, Marion, Linn, Lane, Coos, Curry, Douglas, Jackson and Josephine counties, are as follows:

Chinese pheasants, sooty or blue grouse, ruffed grouse or native pheasants—Open season from October 15 to October 31. Bag limit, four of any such birds in any one day, or eight during any seven consecutive days; provided, that not more than two female Chinese pheasants may be killed in any seven consecutive days. No open season in Lincoln, Tillamook, Clatsop and Curry counties.

Mountain or plumed and California or valley quail—Open season from October 15 to October 31 in Jackson, Josephine, Coos and Curry counties only. All other

counties closed. Bag limit, ten of such birds in any seven consecutive days.

Silver gray squirrels—Open season from September 15 to October 15. Bag limit, five squirrels in any seven consecutive days. No closed season in Multnomah, Clackamas, Marion, Yamhill, Washington, Benton, Polk, Linn, Lane, Douglas and Josephine counties.

Bob White quail—No open season.

Ducks, geese, rails, coots, Wilson snipe or jacksnipe, and greater and lesser yellow-legs—Open season from October 1 to January 15 of the following year, both days inclusive. Bag limit, 25 of such birds in any one day and not to exceed 30 of such birds in any seven consecutive days, except that bag limit on geese shall be eight in any one day and not to exceed 30 in any seven consecutive days.

Bear—Open season during month of November in Josephine and Jackson counties. All other counties open season all year.
