DOPE IS SENT BY AIR

CANADIAN POLICE ON LOOK-OUT FOR DRUG PLANES

VANCOUVER, B. C., Aug. 28.—An extensive search of landing places on the shores of English bay and Howe sound, near here, was being conducted by Royal Canadian mounted police tonight...

Today's find was the third big package of narcotics discovered by authorities in the last few months, bringing the total found to \$30,000 worth.

The drugs were wrapped in layers of cork and were packed in a case with Oriental markings on the outside.

RAIN DAMAGE IS SEVERE

COLORADO RAIL EQUIPMENT WRECKED BY STORM

SALT LAKE CITY, Utah, Aug. 28.—(By the Associated Press)—Damage to Denver & Rio Grande Western railroad tracks, bridges and equipment as a result of a cloudburst yesterday near Verde, Utah, 147 miles south and east of here, is estimated at about \$200,000...

Eight small bridges and a mile of track were washed out and in the meantime traffic is being routed via Union Pacific tracks.

Five freight cars were swept from the rails but no train employees were injured.

Near Logan, north of here, and in other sections, heavy rains caused landslides and in many instances roads were reported blocked.

Rain was general over the north and central parts of Utah yesterday and last night. No great damage to crops has been reported.

GERMANY ACCEPTS NOTE

FRANCE PROPOSAL ACCEDDED TO BY TEUTON NATION

PARIS, Aug. 28.—(By Associated Press)—In a 200 word note the German government places itself on record as accepting the proposal of France, made in behalf of the allies in the negotiations for a security pact...

The communication, the text of which was made public today, is in direct reply to the French note delivered in German hands early in the week.

It is written in a friendly tone and says Germany agrees with the allies that the time for exchanging notes has passed.

LONDON.—Probationary methods for adults and the "Borstal" treatment for young people have been responsible for a marked decrease in the population of British prisons.

So much so that more than 20 jails in England and Wales, or one-third of the total, have been closed since 1914.

There are now only about 40 prisons in use throughout the country and these are not fully occupied.

A Home Office official says that fewer and fewer people are being committed to prison because the tendency now is to reform a man or woman if it be at all possible.

The increased use of probationary methods has worked well and in the opinion of the official the time is not far distant when prisons will be used only for habitual criminals with whom all attempts at reform have failed.

US Auto Man Optimistic Over German Conditions

BERLIN.—Germany shows signs of increasing stability that warrants business confidence, says John N. Willys, of Cleveland, Chairman of the Foreign Trade Committee of the National Automobile Chamber of Commerce.

"The efforts which are being made towards the readjustment of business to normal conditions will do much to remove the uncertainty now surrounding the enterprise because of the prevailing restrictions on trade between Germany and other countries," Mr. Willys stated.

He believes that the abrogation of these postwar impediments will stimulate freer commerce especially between Germany and the United States.

The German officials, he said, were sincerely endeavoring to bring about an improvement in the trading conditions between both countries.

As a result of informal conversations between the American motor interests and official German circles it is believed that a liberal increase in the present import quota for American cars will shortly be decreed.
