probably without sleep and almost without food.

The searching airplanes were forced to retire with the coming of darkness and even the patroling submarines slipped back to a meridian closer to the protecting islands, but the aircraft tenders and the destroyer Farragut continued the hunt tonight, cutting through the shadows with their searchlights.

The army tug Cuba will arrive at Lahaina tomorrow with pilots and 150 drums of gasoline and oil for Lieutenant McConnell's detachment of search squadrons which have been ordered to organize by pairs, the planes not to be in the air more than six hours at a stretch and generally to return by noon.

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 2.—(By Associated Press.)—Gasoline tanks alone on the missing PN-9 No. 1 if empty would have a buoyancy of 10,855 pounds in fresh water, H. S. Cocklin, designer of the great seaplanes, stated to the Associated Press today. In salt water which is heavier, the buoyancy would be even greater.

The plane as it left San Francisco under Commander Rodgers to attempt a non-stop flight to Honolulu weighed 9,100 pounds, he said. The weight of the crew would give an additional 1,000

pounds but, calculating personnel and cargo the gas tanks alone would float it.

Added to this buoyancy of more than five tons is 3,200 pounds given by the tip floats and still additional floating capacity would come from the lubricating oil tanks if they were nearly empty. Taking advantage of the buoyancy of the gas tanks, however, he declared, it would have been necessary for the crew to have had a minute or two of time after striking the surface to plug vents. This would not be mechanically difficult, said the designer of the navy plane in Philadelphia. Accomplished it would make it impossible for the plane to sink. However, he said, if in alighting the main gasoline line of the plane should have been broken or some other accident happened, the tanks would take on water and they would not have their normal buoyancy.

Each man on the aircraft was equipped with a life preserver and signalling rockets and flares were carried.

CHINESE TREATY IS TO BE CARRIED OUT

at the tariff conference which is to convene in Peking October 28, already had been announced, but until the secretary spoke tonight there had been no indication as to who would represent the United States on the extra territorial commission.

Mr. Kellogg recounted at length the extensive record of American-Chinese difficulties attributed to tariff and special privilege questions before he mentioned the recent demand of the provisional government of China that the foreign powers relinquish the special rights. Referring then to the conference he has proposed for the purpose of investigating the question of extra territoriality, Chinese laws and judicial system, he said:

"I know, in a general way, that within the last few years China has made some progress in the enactment of laws in reform of her judicial proceedings in the education of judges and lawyers with a view to fulfilling her aspirations to be relieved of the extra territorial restrictions upon the

exercise of her sovereign powers.

"I believe the people of this country sympathize with the aspirations of the Chinese people and that this government would be willing to give up the extra territorial rights as soon as China shall demonstrate that her laws and the administration of the laws and judicial system are adequate for the protection of foreign lives and property within China."
