HEALTH MOVEMENT MEETING IS CALLED

All Parts of County Expected to Be Represented Saturday Afternoon

With the opening of the school year, the services of the Marion county Child health demonstration will be made available to every community in the county on a larger scale than heretofore.

In order to come in contact with people from all parts of the county who are interested in the health of children, a meeting has been called at the Salem Chamber of Commerce for Saturday afternoon of this week.

In order to secure the greatest benefit from the great child health work of the demonstration, it is desirable that the demonstration staff work through existing organizations in each community.

Officials of all community organizations in the county, as well as those of judges, churches, schools and civic bodies, have been especially urged to attend the meeting Saturday afternoon.

Mary L. Fulkerson, county superintendent of schools, who has been co-operating throughout the county with the Marion County Child Health Demonstration, will preside at the Saturday meeting.

Marion county is one of the four fortunate counties in the United States where the children will have the special advantages offered through the funds of the Commonwealth funds of New York City. According to its program, four counties are selected for a five year program. Other cities having the advantage of this health program are Fargo, S. D., Athens, Georgia and Murfreesboro, Tennessee.

Dr. Walter H. Brown, director of the demonstration, is regarded in the east as one of the leading child health experts in the country. In his work in Marion county, he is assisted by a staff of twenty.
