natural floral picture than a well grown peony when in its full glory of bloom. If you have never seen a collection of fine peonies you will be amazed at their beauty.
Wonderful Plant
A visitor to Oregon after seeing the peony garden in bloom, in a letter to her mother, said: "If I told you half of the beauty and size of these flowers, you would probably say, 'yes, everything grows big in Oregon, even the liars.'"
The blooms are large; one bloom will make as nice a bouquet as half a dozen rose buds. They are showy, and of various forms and of all shades of color, from white to purple and even pale yellow.
Peonies can be bought from 50 cents to \$150 per single root, depending on the scarcity of variety and its merits as rated by peony lovers, but each year it increases in size of plant and number of blooms, until it becomes so large, after some seven or eight years, that it must be divided and reset; and then one's investment is repaid.

paid him many times, for where he had one, he will now have many plants to charm the passer-by.
Peony Does Double Duty
Most varieties of the peony are in bloom in my garden the last week in May, but by a careful selection of the early midseason and late varieties one can have bloom for six weeks or even longer. Many varieties will keep in the house as cut flowers for two weeks or more. A word of caution just here: If you want to see the wonderful tints of the more delicately colored varieties, cut the flower just as the first petals begin to unfold and allow it to open indoors out of the direct sunlight.
The peony stays green all summer, thus making it equally successful for artistic landscape as for wealth of bloom.
My garden is located three and one half miles south of Salem on the Liberty highway, one fourth mile south of the Salem Heights community club hall.
A visit during the blooming season will be worth while if you love flowers.
A house is not a home without a garden and September, October and November is the best time to plant peonies, but the sooner they can be planted the more apt they are to bloom the first year after planting. Though not all plants will bloom the first year.

Peony Does Double Duty
Most varieties of the peony are in bloom in my garden the last week in May, but by a careful selection of the early midseason and late varieties one can have bloom for six weeks or even longer. Many varieties will keep in the house as cut flowers for two weeks or more. A word of caution just here: If you want to see the wonderful tints of the more delicately colored varieties, cut the flower just as the first petals begin to unfold and allow it to open indoors out of the direct sunlight.
The peony stays green all summer, thus making it equally successful for artistic landscape as for wealth of bloom.
My garden is located three and one half miles south of Salem on the Liberty highway, one fourth mile south of the Salem Heights community club hall.
A visit during the blooming season will be worth while if you love flowers.
A house is not a home without a garden and September, October and November is the best time to plant peonies, but the sooner they can be planted the more apt they are to bloom the first year after planting. Though not all plants will bloom the first year.
