Labor Shortage Noted

Indication of an increasing shortage of labor for agricultural jobs is reflected in the weekly report yesterday of Sim Phillips, manager of the federal employment bureau at the YMCA here. In the field of agriculture 69 men registered for employment, there were 157 calls for workers, 60 men were referred to jobs, and 53 men reported placed. In all occupations, including both men and women, 285 calls for workers, 161 were referred to jobs and 148 reported placed. Out of 24 women who registered at the bureau during the week, 21 were referred to jobs and 18 reported placed. There were 35 calls for female workers.
