SALEM CANNERIES ARE ALL BUSY YET
Still Going Strong, Mostly on Prunes, Pears and Evergreen Blackberries
The Salem canneries are all still going strong, mostly with a long season ahead.
The Hunt cannery is on prunes and evergreen blackberries. Almost done with prunes. Evergreens may come for a week or two yet.
The Oregon Packing company in its Twelfth street cannery will finish with pears tomorrow. In their Thirteenth street cannery they are getting a full supply of beans and cucumbers, and will soon be on pumpkins there.
The Pacific Canning & Packing company cannery (West Salem) is running full handed (with 300 employees) on prunes, pears and evergreens. They will soon be working on apples.
The Starr cannery is on prunes, and will be for a week or ten days and on evergreens, for perhaps a couple of weeks yet.
The Northwest cannery is get-

ting prunes yet; also evergreens and pears.
The Producers Canning & Packing company is finishing up on prunes. Will be through this week.
The canneries that are to use apples will be going till the holidays.

Those interested in Mr. Cassill's first question are invited to write him. It is likely that he refers especially to loganberry juice.
The growing of good loganberries is not adapted to the south. This kind of the bush fruits attains perfection only in a climate and with a soil such as we have in the Salem district—in western Oregon and Washington.
Yes; the loganberry is successfully dehydrated, or dried.
There is no doubt but a great market might be found in Dixie Land for our loganberries, put up in cans, frozen, or dehydrated or dried, and for loganberry juice.

The annual Slogan number of The Statesman devoted to the loganberry industry will be published soon, and the Slogan editor will take pains to see that Mr. Cassill receives a copy. There is
