

HEILIG VAUDEVILLE IS TO OPEN TODAY

Matinee and Two Evening Shows to Be Presented to Salem Audiences

Salem theatergoers will find five excellent numbers on the vaudeville program at the Heilig theatre today when that theater will present its first footlight performance. Hereafter, on every Friday a vaudeville bill will be presented. Three shows will be held, a matinee at 2 o'clock, and evening shows at 7 and 9 o'clock. For the premier performance, the cream of the Association vaudeville has been secured. On the program are the following acts: O'Brien Sisters & Mack, in their "Bits of Musical Comedy." It is a beautiful singing, musical and dancing number. W. C. Dornfield, a good-natured soldier-actor, with the irresistible smile, has developed into a monologist of merit. Little tricks of magic are interspersed with his chatter.

Third on the program is Singer Dale and Dixie De Lene, in their "Musical Comedy Surprise." The act is classic in style and dance.
