"Such a talent enlarges life. One is endeared alike to old and young."

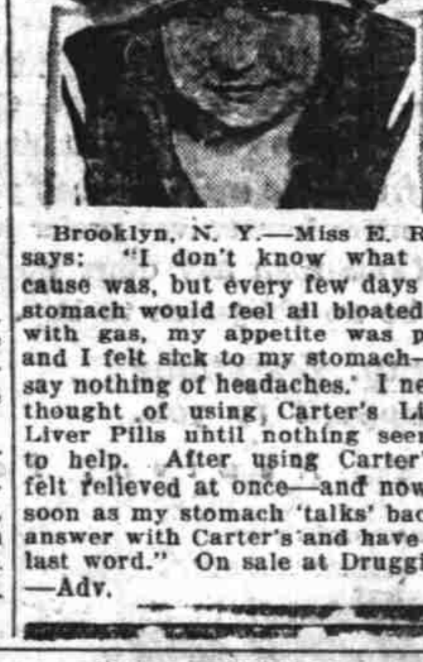
The teachers walked out, talking eagerly. "Her versatility is remarkable, but I envy equally her charm. Everybody adores Miss Young. He did not explain that."
