

Make Eight Months Trip for Short Look at Sun

WASHINGTON. - An -eight months' trip half way around the world for two minutes of actual work will be the experience of a party from the Naval observatory that has left to observe the total eclipse of the sun in January 1926 at Sumatra in the Dutch East

Indies. British, German and French parties also will be at Sumatra, as well as a party from Swarthmore college. The Italians will have an observation party in east-

The American naval group will endeavor to observe phenomena in connection with the upward curve of the sunspot cycle, and will study the sun's corona as well. Motion pictures and color plates of the eclipse will be made. Special attention will be given to the sun's gases, which scientists say extend as far as two million miles from the sun's rim when

the moon blots out its face. The party will travel on the naval minesweeper Bittern from Manila to Sumatra. Inexpects to reach its destination in October and the three months' interim before the eclipse occurs on January 14-visible only from Africa to the Indian Ocean-will be spent in erecting housing and telescope tower.

Lieutenant Henry C. Kellers, a naval doctor, has been detailed to the expedition at the request of the Smithsonian institution, to coland insects. The others in the 2:00-Pioneer Days in the party are Captain Frank B. Lit-Branch, direction Mrs. J. T. Ab- tell, professor of mathematics; George H. Peters, associate astro nomer; G. M. Raynsford, junior astronomer; and Dr. John A. Anderson of Mt. Wilson observatory, Pasadena, Calif., physicist.

> (Continued from page 1,) into the Klamath country and bought timber. We bought in 1905, 1907 and 1908. In the last year, the extension of the Hill lines down to Klamath Lake was known. We were preparing to evelon our timber holdings, when the railroad plans were changed. construction stopped and we postponed our own schemes for cut-

ting the timber. "It was always our idea that the district around Klamath Falls embraced such a large body of timber that more than one railroad would fully be waranted to handle it. We have delayed development because there are not additional rail facilities. Three roads can give you more cars thar one, particularly when you need them badly. Bend operators, I believe, have been much helped by having three railroads."
