

CORN SHOW LETTER URGING EXHIBITS

Chamber of Commerce Is Arousing Interest in Big Event Next Month

The Salem Chamber of Commerce is sending out a circular letter to all the farmers who exhibited at the corn show field last year.

Just a few years ago, a lot of people didn't believe that Marion and Polk counties could hold a big corn show and prove that we could grow corn equal to the best Iowa, Illinois or Kansas corn.

Last year and the year before at the Salem Armory, there was exhibited corn that was a credit to the best corn growing sections of the country.

Last year you entered corn for the big corn show and we are now asking you to enter your corn again and to also ask your neighbors to take an interest in the big corn event and bring in exhibits.

The corn crop in general is much better this year than a year ago. This year, with your help and other corn growers, we will exhibit corn that will surpass the natives as well as those who moved to the Willamette valley from corn growing states back east.

Last year there were about 125 exhibits of corn from Marion and Polk counties. There is room for more.

So we are counting on you and also your influence to have your neighbors bring in exhibits. As usual, there is no charge of any kind.

So please begin collecting your best corn and getting it ready for exhibit. The enclosed premium list will tell you about prizes. Hand one to your neighbor who grows corn.

REINBRECHT WILL CASE IS REVERSED

Marion County Man Wins Long Legal Battle; Astoria Is Also Victor

Upon appeal to the supreme court, August Reinbrecht, administrator of the estate of Johanna Dietz, widow of Charles F. Dietz, who made a will April 26, 1905, pertaining to real estate in Canada and giving her the right to dispose of this and interest in Oregon property, won his case Tuesday when Justice Burnett handed down an opinion reversing the late Judge George G. Bingham, of Marion county.

Reinbrecht objected to the final account filed by Edward Schinke, executor of his wife's estate. The county court

sustained the objection but this was reversed in the circuit court. Mrs. Reinbrecht died September 21, 1921.

Mandamus proceedings brought by the City of Astoria against the Clatsop county court in an effort to compel the court to levy a road tax, part of which would be available for use by the city, were upheld Tuesday in a decision by Justice Bennett of the supreme court, which reversed Judge J. A. Eakin of the lower court in Clatsop county. Under the law the money accruing to the city may be used for street building and maintenance.
