PERFECTS FLAX PULLING MACHINE. Jos. A. Bartosz, Salem, Has a Puller That Is Pronounced Success

propelled by team power, while a compact gasoline engine, mounted on the rear of the binder operates the pulling rollers through a very simple arrangement of bevel gears, the speed of the rollers timed to such a nicety that there is never any crowding or binding of the flax at the pulling end, and while the flax being pulled today as witnessed by the writer and others, was somewhat tangled and matted on account of being dried out this late in the season, the bundles as pulled came out neat and even, and the field was actually left cleaner than if the flax had been pulled by hand.

STATE FLAX INDUSTRY HAS DOUBLED ITS CAPACITY DURING THE PAST YEAR

As Developments Come in the Manufacturing of Flax Yarn and Linen Products, There Will Have to Be More Retting and Scutching Plants, and They Will have to Be Located Near the Flax Fields

Editor Statesman: As we approach to the end of another year, we naturally pause for the moment, and in retrospection sum up the events that are responsible for the development of the industries contributing to our civil welfare. Our attention is particularly attracted at this time by the growth of the state flax industry in the Willamette valley. The city of Salem has many notable attractions and many industries that are daily contributing to the wealth of the founders or those industries, and to that of the ones who are directly or indirectly dependent upon them. While we take a keen interest in the achievements of these worthy enterprises, we must reserve our most favorable comments for the part of the people of the Willamette valley, and especially the people of Salem, have taken in developing the flax industry. Doubled Capacity. From a small beginning only a few years ago, the flax industry has grown to become a thriving and pretentious business. Only a few acres of flax were grown in the beginning, and then more by way of experiment than in hope of profit. The past year approximately 2,500 acres of fiber flax was grown in the Willamette valley near Salem. As the acreage increased it was necessary to provide more modern facilities for manufacturing the flax straw into the finished product. The state flax industry, anticipating this increased growth, has added more retting tanks, enlarged its plant, and installed machinery that will undoubtedly double the capacity

The Lincn Mills. One well equipped linen mill is new in operation in Salem, and another mill is proposed and practically assured. They must be supplied with materials for the manufacture of their product. To satisfy their demands there must be plants with greater capacities for retting the straw, and scutching the fiber.
