

LON CHENEY PICTURE TO COME HERE SOON

The Phantom of the Opera Thrilling Spectacle Coming to Salem

Following directly upon its sensational New York showing, Universal's spectacular mystery-romance, "The Phantom of the Opera," will be seen here at the Oregon theatre.

This adaptation of the famous novel by Gaston Leroux, the noted French exponent of the weird and sensational, directed by Rupert Julian, includes spectacular scenes and settings which are the result of six months preparation and the work of hundreds of experts in photography, lighting, mining engineering and construction. A detailed reproduction of the historic Paris Opera house was constructed presenting a remarkable motion picture set asserted to be one of the largest and most elaborate ever built for a motion picture. The five tiers of cellars under the opera house were cut from the side of a mountain, the lowest of which was flooded, converting it into a subterranean lake.

When the first scene of the interior of the historic Paris Opera House is shown upon the screen the audience will witness a remarkable motion picture set, constructed at Universal City by a staff of one hundred and fifty technicians, there arose a complete reproduction, minute to the last detail.

Tier upon tier of boxes line the sides, and three thousand people in the audience listen to a magnificent one hundred piece orchestra rendered "Faust," while it is actually acted upon an enormous stage by operatic stars. A ballet of seventy-five dancers, many from the Metropolitan Opera House in New York, were assembled and trained by Ernest Belcher. The perfection of their work will present and inspiring sight.

The foyer, the grand staircase and the domed ceiling from which is suspended an enormous chandelier, forty feet in diameter and weighing sixteen thousand pounds, which plays an important part in the picture, are all reproduced exactly.
