Summation having been completed for the defense, court was adjourned until tomorrow, when the jury will receive the case for deliberation. Justice Morschauser indicated that his charge will be brief.

"Give this boy a chance to reclaim himself and the name he has besmirched under the divilment of the defendant," Mr. Mills pleaded. He accused Alice of having consistently pursued "a diabolical plan of campaign to ensnare Rhinelander."

"She had brains," the lawyer said. "At the end of a year of her campaign she owned the boy body and soul."

SON WILL BEGIN FOUR-YEAR SENTENCE TODAY

Spending more than an hour in the executive department yesterday, Mrs. W. G. MacLaren of Portland pleaded for leniency for her son, Allan MacLaren, who is under four years penitentiary sentence for a statutory crime committed in Clackamas county.

Governor Pierce informed Mrs. MacLaren that he had given the case careful study, and that he would not interfere in the decree of the court. It was said that young MacLaren would be brought here today to start serving his term.

MacLaren's father is prominent in Portland where he has been engaged in welfare work for many years. He was until recently a member of the state parole board.

ATLANTIC STORM RAGES

SHIPPING DAMAGED; DOUBLE COAST PATROL ORDERED

NEW YORK, Dec. 3.—(By the Associated Press.)—The storm which lashed the Florida coast earlier in the week and broke yesterday over New Jersey and New York, reached such an intensity today that the coast guard headquarters at Ashbury Park ordered a double patrol along the entire New Jersey coast tonight.

No loss of life was reported although the general property damage was high. The Connecticut coast was pounded by high waves running before a rain-laden gale.

Beach structures at Coney Island were demolished and restaurants flooded. Marine police succeeded in taking a building in tow after the structure had been blown off its piles and drifted almost to Sandy Hook. When the building crashed into the sea several workmen had narrow escapes. In it

Russians Now Marry on Three Year Probation

BERLIN—Marriages on three year probation have been authorized by the Soviet government, writes the Berliner Lokal Anzeiger. After this period both parties will be privileged to contract a new and permanent marriage, if mutually the bond has proved unsatisfactory. Otherwise, each party will be at liberty to separate without going through any of the usual divorce formalities.

The law was passed to clarify the state of matrimonial confusion existing in Russia, said the Anzeiger. The probationary marriage needs only to be registered at the city clerk's office. If the marriage ends in failure, the registrar will simply draw a blue pencil mark through both names, whereby, officially at least, the marriage will be shown never to have existed.

The present age at which a young man in Russia may marry is 18 and that of a girl 16. The wife may either adopt the name of her husband or retain her own. A third contingency is that the husband may adopt his wife's name.

The children again may also be named after the father or mother or one child may assume the name of one parent and another that of the other.

CENTER POINT, Iowa.—Although Beryl Hunter, 19, has a cork leg, he is a regular member of the Center Point high school football team. He plays center. Coach Alfred Kline said the boy is a good player; that he makes tackles along with the rest of the squad and asks no favors because of his handicap.

"He is a game youngster," Coach Kline declared, "and I use him at center because he is the best player we have for the position. Last year Beryl played on the basketball team."

FINANCE BILL ACCEPTED BIRAND PLAYS ON PATRIOTISM TO SECURE ADOPTION

PARIS, Dec. 3.—(By Associated Press.)—Premier Briand's appeal to the patriotism of all parties to unite to save France, today brought about the adoption of the government's bill providing for inflation of the currency to the amount of 7,500,000,000 francs and additional taxation ranging from twenty to 100 per cent in the chamber of deputies. This evening the finance committee of the senate accepted the text of the financial bill. It is virtually certain that the senate will adopt the bill tomorrow.

In the chamber, the final vote on the bill as a whole was 257 to 229. It constituted the fifth vote of confidence in the government during the lengthy session. The smallest majority in the voting which the government received was seven—a vote of 246 to 239 on the inflation section of the bill.

Premier Briand appeared before the house, having passed a sleepless night, tired and harassed but he rose to heights of eloquence

never surpassed in the history of French politics.

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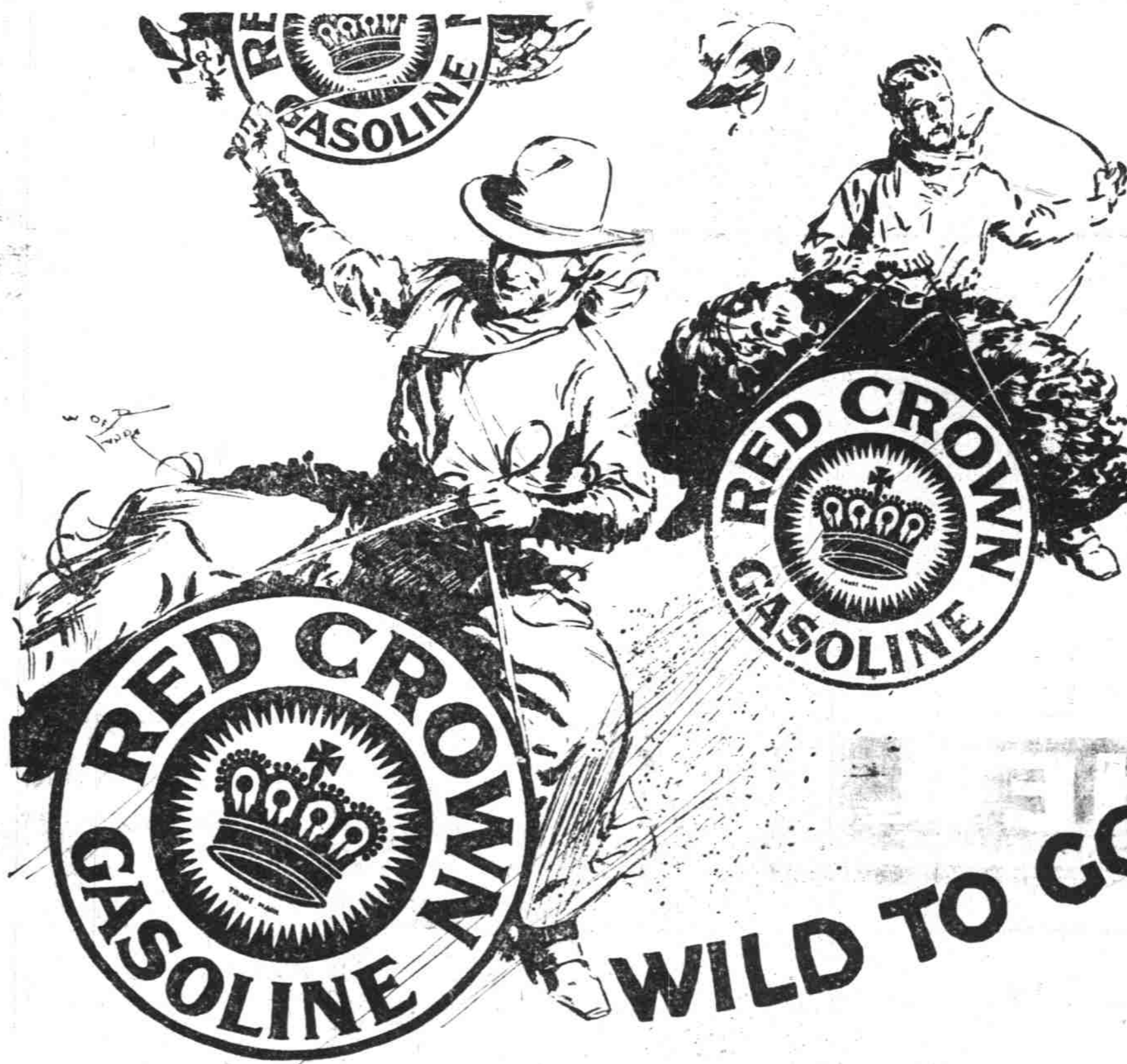
