PUBLISHED SUMMONS In the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon, for Marion County.

To Agnes Eskelson Marsh and Burton F. Marsh, Defendants: In the name of the State of Oregon, you are hereby required to appear and plead to the complaint filed against you in the above entitled suit on or before the date of the last publication of this summons, to-wit: on or before the 9th day of January, 1926, and if you fail to appear and plead to said complaint for want thereof the plaintiff will take judgment against you and apply to the court for the relief prayed for in its complaint, to-wit:

(a) For a judgment against Agnes Eskelson Marsh and Burton F. Marsh, and each of them, for the sum of \$1717.42 with interest thereon at the rate of ten per cent per annum from August 20, 1924, the further sum of \$38.37 with interest thereon from March 6, 1925, at the rate of ten per cent per annum; the further sum of \$158.43 with interest thereon from May 27, 1925, at the rate of ten per cent per annum; the further sum of \$175.00 attorney's fees; the further sum of \$18.50, searching records, and its costs and disbursements herein;

(b) That the mortgage herein be decreed to be a prior, valid and subsisting lien for the amount due upon said note, payment of taxes, attorney's fees and searching records, and a good, valid and subsisting lien as to the claims of each and all of the defendants herein; that said mortgage be foreclosed and the defendants and each of them be barred and foreclosed of any right, title or interest in and to said real property or any part thereof;

(c) That said real property be forthwith sold by the sheriff of Marion county, Oregon, after giving the notice required by law; that any party to this suit may be a purchaser at said sale; that such purchaser be let into the immediate possession of said real property; that said sheriff give to such purchaser a certificate of sale and after the time allowed by law for redemption, unless said real property shall have been redeemed, a deed; and for such other and further relief as may seem meet to the court.

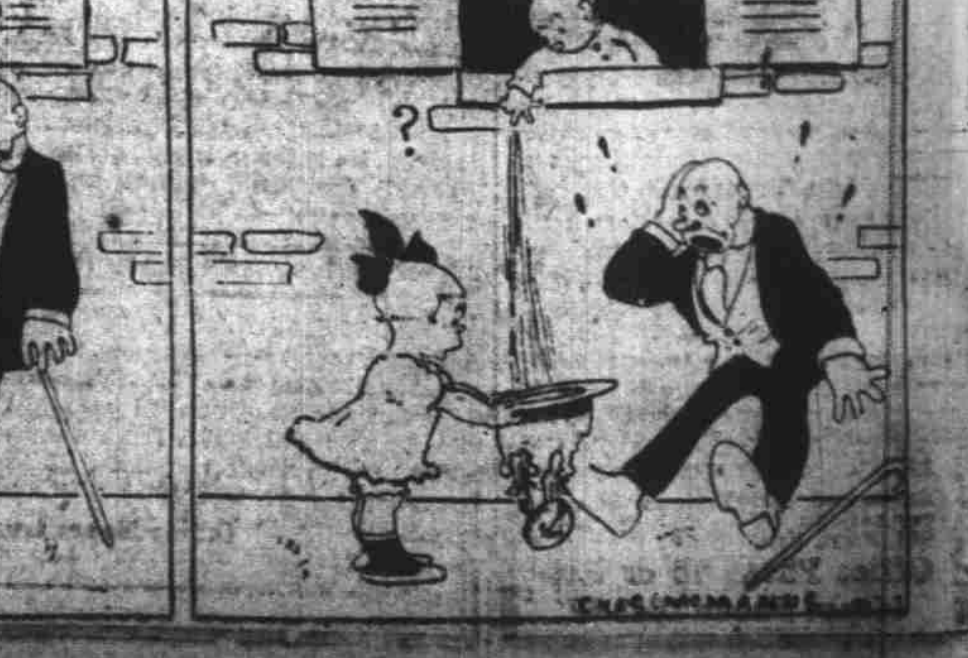
