### SOUSA'S BAND WILL PAY SALEM A VISIT

Noted Conductor to Appear Here at Heilig Theatre on January 22

Lieutenant Commander John Phillip Sousa, conductor of the "World Famous Band" consisting of 100 musicians, will appear in Salem January 22, announced the management of the Heilig theatre last night. This band concert will come as the culmination of one of the greatest "theater-collecting" months in the history of Salem, it is stated.

This band—Sousa's own, and known as the greatest assemblage of true band musicians throughout the world—is making its third of a century tour of the United States and has accepted an engagement in Salem.

The concert will be held in the armory, it is stated, due to the greater seating capacity, but will be under the management of the Heilig theatre. This will give music lovers a better chance to hear a band which has toured the United States as well as Europe. The armory will be splendidly decorated for the occasion, it is said, and every available seat will be placed.

John Phillip Sousa comes this year with an entire new list of compositions created by himself, besides the pieces made famous by his bands in recent years. The list includes such compositions as "The Black Horse Troop March," "The National Game," "Cuba Under Three Flags," and his famous "The Stars and Stripes Forever" march.

The man Sousa recently celebrated his 70th birthday in Chicago and in so doing led his band in two inspiring concerts besides signing a contract to conduct the band for a period of 20 years.

Following the concert the people who heard it claimed that the band this season has a mellowness, flexibility and a facility that other bands may grope for a long time to attain.

This alone does not make up the great "theater" month as announced by the Heilig management. It is stated, as several musical comedy and plays have been scheduled to appear.

Robert B. Mantell and company will appear here January 13 in a Shakespearean play. This play is to be chosen by the people of Salem, it is stated. The people will be asked to make known their choice to the management.

Other entertainments include the Bringing Up Father company in a musical comedy play entitled "New York." In all, it promises to be the biggest season of entertainment ever indulged in by Salem theaters, it is stated.

### NEGRO KILLS INTRUDER

ATTEMPT TO GAIN ENTRANCE INTO HOUSE IS FATAL

PORTLAND, Jan. 2.—(By Associated Press.)—Jimmy Modana, a white man aged about 30, was shot and killed here this afternoon by Frank Freeman, a negro, 41.

Freeman said Modana came to his home yesterday and demanded admittance which was refused. This afternoon he returned with another man and a woman who was attired in man's clothing.

Modana began hammering at the front door of the house, according to first information, and Freeman shot through the door. One of the shots passed through Modana's heart. Liquor and glasses were found by the police on a table in the Freeman home.

### Turkish Styles Are in Favor as Moslem Becomes Modern

LONDON—Now that Turkish women have come out for modern dress there is a tendency here and in Paris to slip back a hundred years or so and bring to the front some of the ideas which Constantinople has discarded during the last few weeks.

Veils, abolished a short time ago by Turkish women, are coming back. Modestly, they are not only becoming but protect the wearers from cold winds and any weak little flu germs which might be hovering about in the air.

### Substitutes for English Tennis Terms Criticized

PARIS.—"Lob," "smash" and "drive," as applied to tennis are three words the translation of which into French has stumped the French sporting writers in a campaign to eliminate the English vocabulary from their articles on sport events.

The best they have been able to find is "chandelie" for "lob," "coup de longue" for "drive" and "coup cecece" for "smash."

Jean Sarracault, former champion of France at tennis, takes exception to the accuracy and practicability of the translation and in an article in a sports weekly asks the players to ignore the scribes, and especially to execute the shots well on the courts, let the writers call them what they wish.

### Agricultural Schools Form Mexican Farm Program

MEXICO CITY.—The program of the Calles government for the agricultural improvement and development of Mexico is gradually being effected.

Already five Central Agricultural Schools have been established, one in each of the states of Oaxaca, Hidalgo, Michoacan, Durango and Guanajuato. It is planned to eventually start such schools in every state.

The agricultural promotion projects also contemplate the creation of State and Regional banks expressly intended to extend credits and loans to worthy farmers.

More than 20 Mexican students in United States agricultural schools are preparing themselves for professorships in the new Mexican schools.

The senatorial seat to which he had been shown was the identical one in which an accused before the high court, he had sat for over a month during the famous trial in 1920.

It was explained that no offense had been meant, but by coincidence it was the only seat that happened to be vacant "to the left."
