

BUSES SPEED UP TRANSPORTATION

Service Will Be Continued If
Lines Pay Street Cars
Are Cut Off

Street cars are no longer running on the depot line. In their stead are buses, said to be coming rapidly into vogue for passenger service in cities.

Although service has been lengthened to twenty minutes each run straight through the day, the buses make the run in less time than the street cars did. Passengers boarding the bus at the end of the line are landed at State and Liberty in just ten minutes. The bus is cutting nearly five minutes off the time required by the street cars.

One reason for this reduction of time for a run is given to be that the buses do not have to stop to pass each other as the street cars did. Then, too, the buses are quicker on the pick-up.

Street cars on this line used to come to the end of their run at State and Commercial streets. The buses, however, go only to State and Liberty.

The buses now make as their run the old Seventeenth street bus route and the Yew Park route as well. Two buses are kept on the runs, each making the entire run, from the end of the Seventeenth street line to the end of the Yew Park line, in 20 minutes.

On the Yew Park run, the same route as used by the street cars is used by the buses. Some of the customers on the Seventeenth street line have asked that the route be changed on the return trip to go west on D street to Fifteenth instead of turning north on Sixteenth street.

General favor has met the bus service, according to Salem street railway officials. It is now merely a matter of seeing whether or not the buses can be made to pay. While buses were favored by those on the Seventeenth street line, the company officials claimed this route was too short, and that the buses were not paying. If creation of the longer route will pay, the service will be retained.

COAST ROUTE DISCUSSED COMPLETION OF REDWOOD HIGHWAY GIVEN IMPETUS

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 7.—(By Associated Press).—The movement to complete the Redwood highway running from Sausalito, Calif. to southern Oregon was given added impetus here today at a meeting of a number of interests who are concerned themselves with the future of the artery.

Harvey M. Toy, chairman of the California state highway commission, announced that more than \$11,000,000 had been spent on the Redwood highway to date and as much more would be needed for its completion.

A framed vista of Humboldt country scene with moving clouds, waterfalls and rivers, was a striking feature of the meeting. A group of five "cavemen" from Josephine county, Ore., unveiled a miniature bridge after pronouncing some strange Oregon invocations over it and said that it was a reminder that California must bridge the golden gate in order to link San Francisco with the great Redwood highway.
