LOCAL BATTLES SET FOR GREAT EFFORT

Three Recent Wins Record Means Work if Left Unbroken in Go

With everything to win and everything to lose, Frankie Lewis, Salem welterweight, is doubling his training routine at Silverton and is making every effort to be in trim for the bout with George McCormick at the armory, January 20.

Local fight followers are not much convinced that Lewis can mar McCormick's record. This opinion is not universal, however, as Frankie has record of fighting to the finish and never quitting in a fight.

McCormick's record is enviable. He recently knocked out Bert Tribby, one of the hardest hitters on the coast. Tribby had never before gone down for a count in the ring, although he has met Butting Ortega and others as good.

Lewis has won three recent victories and has disappointed many who expected to see him soundly thrashed. Perhaps he has another winning campaign blocked out against McCormick.

The semi-final between Joe Jewett and Scott Holling is regarded as a special event. Those who enjoyed the last semi-final between Tommy Murphy and the Manila Tiger, are promised as fast a go with these two welterweights as the stars.

Two preliminaries will round out the card.

In the second of these he played a prominent in passing and hitting the line, for good gains, but the first was largely presented to him by his team mates.

Roy "Bullet" Baker, was the only Tiger who was able to make gains against the Bears. Once the Washington star smashed his way through three fourths of the field only to fumble on the Bear four yard line. In the closing minutes of the game he passed and smashed the way to a touchdown.
