December Wet Arrests 108

Activities of state and county prohibition enforcement officials resulted in 108 arrests for liquor law violations in December, according to a report compiled by Wm. Levens, state prohibition commissioner. Thirteen of Oregon's 36 counties failed to make any report for the month, and four other counties reported no arrests. The 108 arrests resulted in 98 convictions with fines assessed aggregat-

ing \$18,336.55, and all sentences imposed aggregating 2782 days, in addition to one sentence of five years in the state prison. Sixteen stills were seized in liquor raids and a total of 285 gallons of liquor were confiscated and destroyed. Fines collected from liquor law violators during the month amounted to \$6,818.88.
