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STALEY FUNERAL SET FOR TODAY

Respected Pioneer, Well Known in Salem, to Be Buried in Portland

Jason Staley was born in Pittsburgh, Pa., Sept. 15, 1849, and died at the Deaconess hospital in Salem, Wednesday evening, Feb. 3, age 76 years. Death came after an illness of about two months.

Mr. Staley was married in Nebraska in the early 70's and shortly afterward came to Oregon, settling on a farm in Linn county, later moving to Portland and then to Salem. To this union nine children were born, six of whom still survive him. They are Mrs. Arthur Webb, John, Sherman and McConnell Staley of Portland; Mrs. Grace Salinger and Mrs. Dora Foote of San Francisco. His wife preceded him in death many years ago.

About 11 years ago Mr. Staley was married to Mrs. Sarah E. Brown, 437 South Commercial, who still survives him. Deceased united with the church while a young man and was a devout Christian since he was a member of the Christian church of Salem and was loved and respected by a host of friends who sincerely mourn his departure.

Funeral services will be held today at 10 o'clock at Rigdon's mortuary and interment will be in the Columbia View cemetery at Portland.

DOWNPOUR SWEEPS OVER COAST STATES

Klamath Falls reported the heaviest rain of the season with no damage and stockmen and farmers exuberant. Snow fell in the Cascades near Crater Lake.

Corvallis reported 1.63 inches of rain in 15 hours.

The main business streets of Sutherlin, Or., were under water and a landslide between Oakland and Sutherlin blocked the highway for several hours. Buses were sent out to transfer stage passengers around the obstruction.

A railroad bridge at Brant, Or., and 250 feet of track were washed out by a flood in Cow Creek canyon, the Southern Pacific Railway company reported. The Shasta limited and train No. 53 were held up as a result.
