What will be done about it? That is a question of the future. The machinery is made in London It is expensive. How expensive will be learned by correspondence. It may be too costly for installation here at the penitentiary plant, without asking the legislature for a special appropriation.

But its installation here would immensely increase the all the year around output of the penitentiary plant. There would not have to be any waiting for dry as a practitioner has caused Mena weather in the summer time for to attract patients from far and retting, or wet weather in the rainy season for scutching.

Another thing. The fiber recovered by the French process is 22 per cent of long line fiber, and 9 per cent of tow. At the penitentiary plant it is 10 per cent of long line fiber and 10 per cent of tow. The difference of recovery, and especially of long line fiber, with as extensive operations as we have here, would very soon pay for a vry xpnsiv installation.

Also a Tow Machine Mr. Quinland saw the tow machine working in the Ford plant; a machine invented by the Ford people. This machine takes the cut straw and extracts the spinning tow from it mechanically, without either retting, drying or scutching.

He also saw at Seaforth, Ontario, 25 miles from Stratford, a spinning tow extracting machine, similar to the Ford machine, but invented and manufactured in Hungary.
