

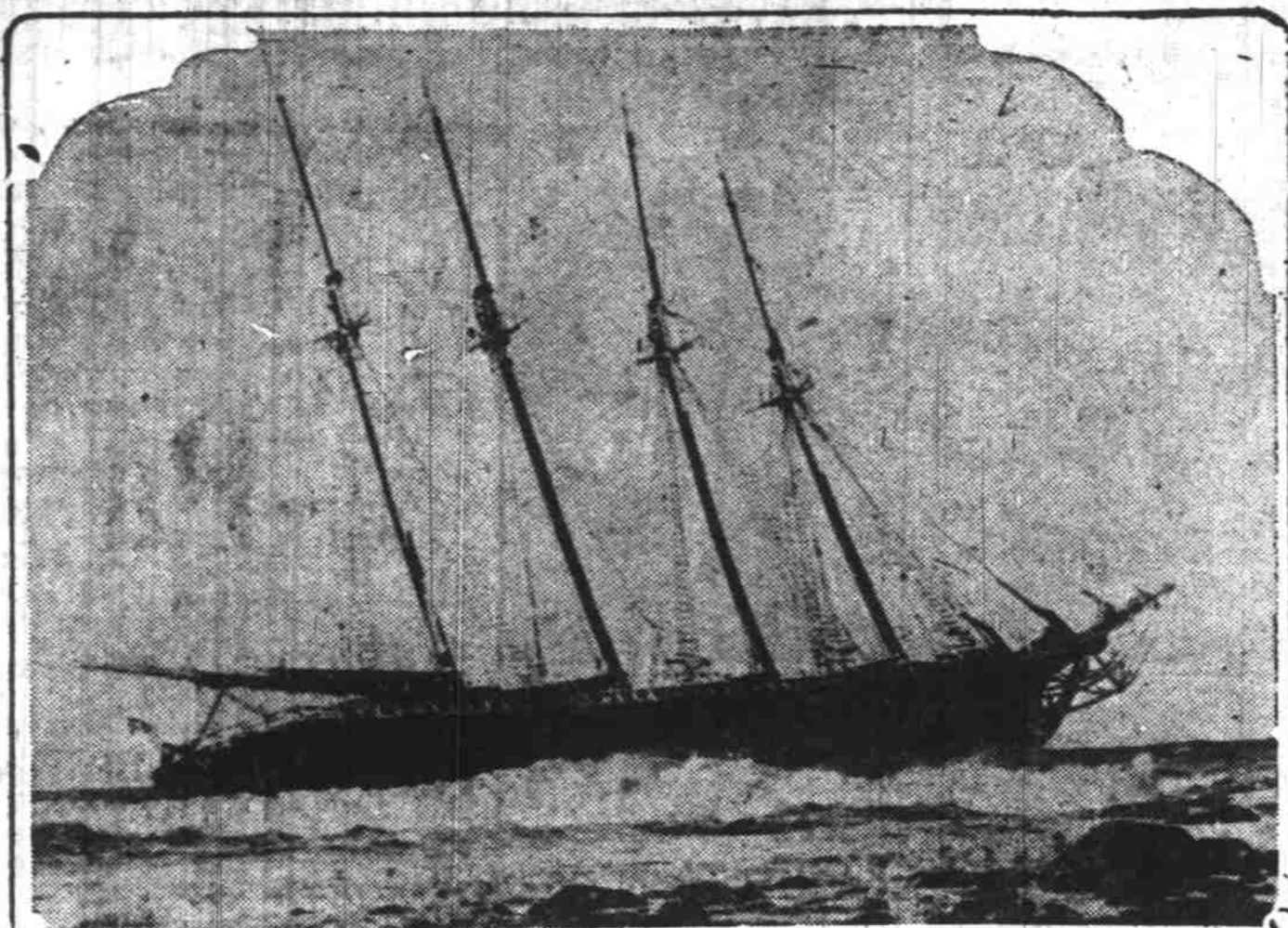

## Storm Smashes Schooner on Shoals



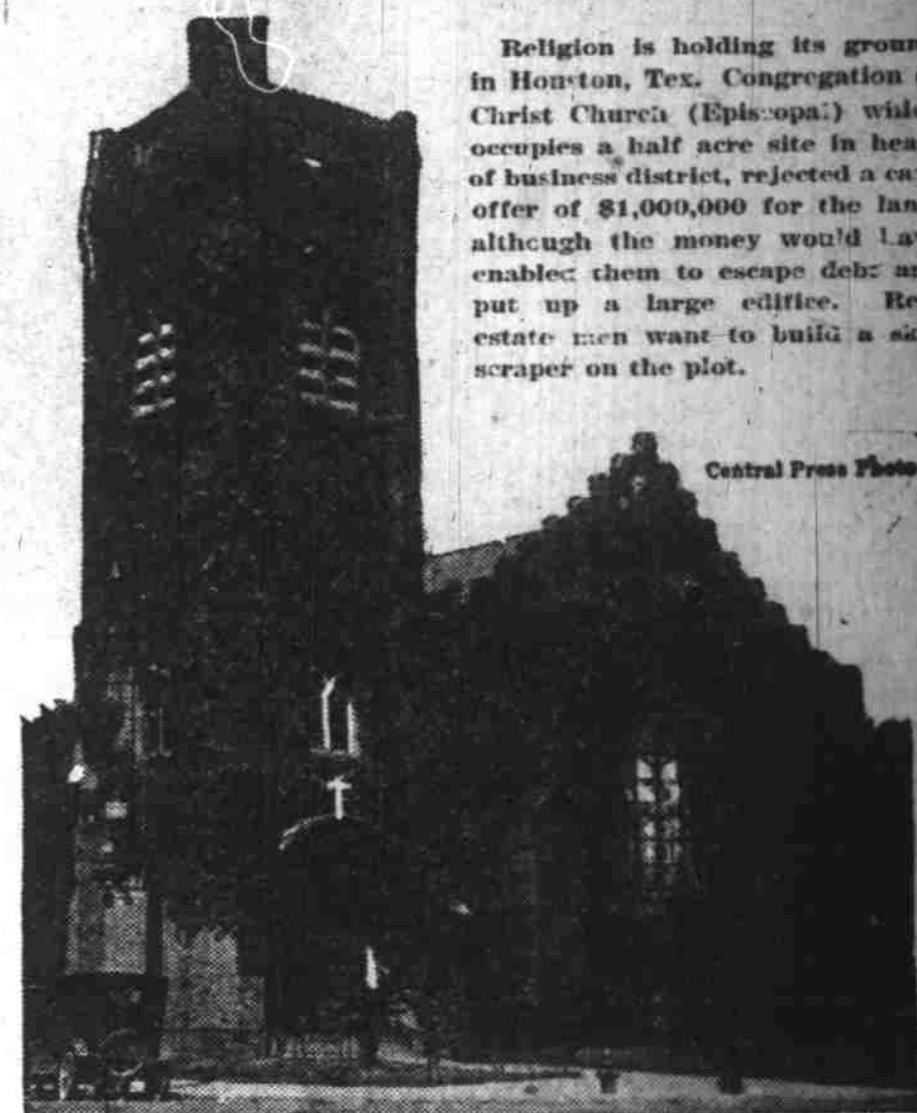

## Given Charge of Alien Property Seized in War



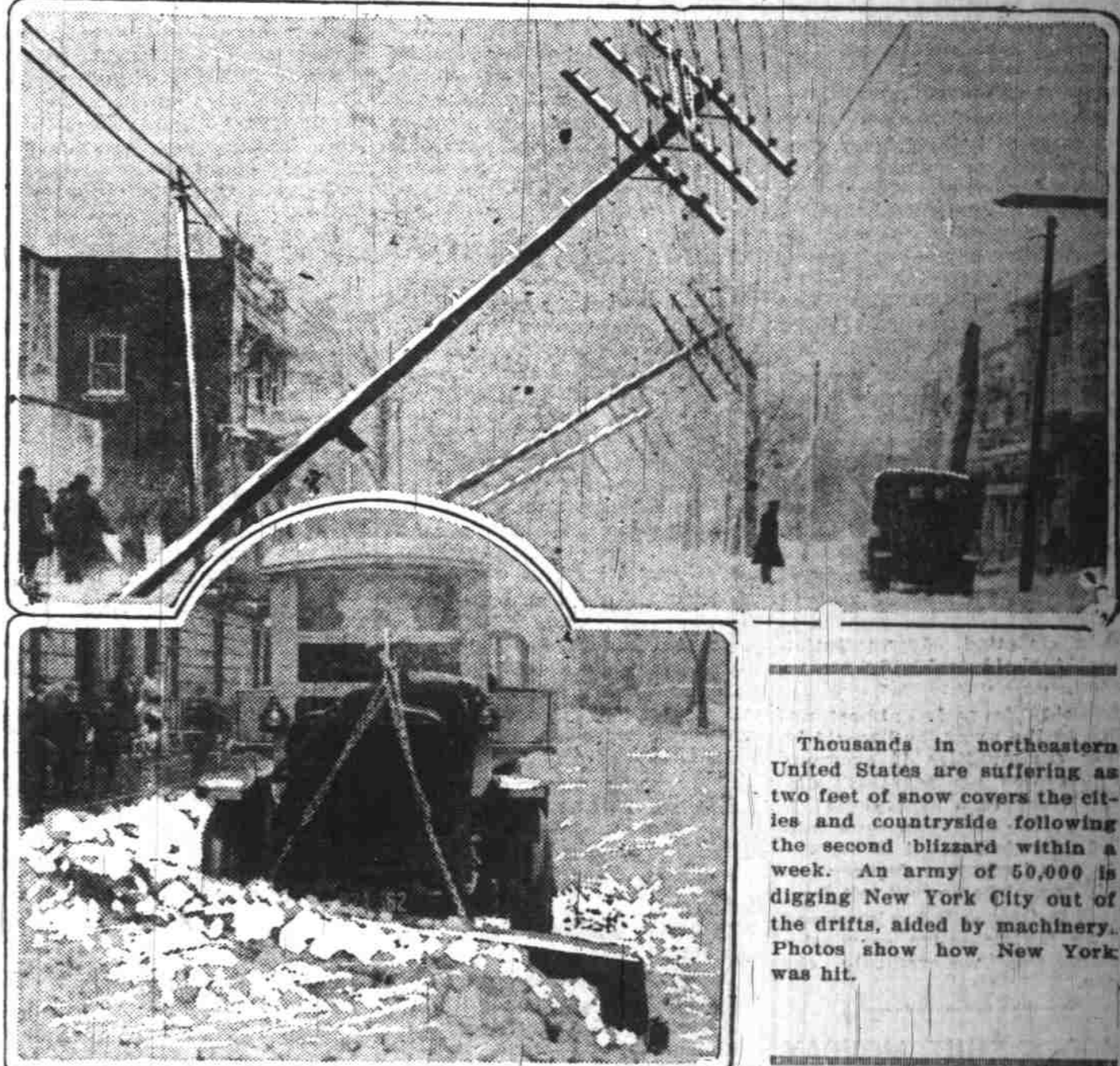
Howard Sutherland, former West Virginia senator is the new alien property custodian, succeeding the late Frederick C. Hicks.
