For the present the state lime board contemplates shipping the tion under his own banner for raw product from the quarry at Marble mountain, near Grants Pass, the present contract holding for at least one more year. The rock crusher at Gold Hill, with a capacity of 10 tons of fertilizer per hour, will probably be retired rom service for the present but, it is hoped, a suitable quarry will be found nearer to Salem, when the machine can be used at a later date.

On the so-called "island," east of the race from the main penitentiary building but within the enclosure, quarters for the machinery will be constructed, the enclosure of the pulverizer, requiring 30-horsepower to operate being dust proof, in order that the finely pulverized lime dust will not pollute the water used in the retting of flax in the penitentlary plant.

It is estimated that 20 men will find employment in the operation of the new industry. As operated at present a smaller number is required, but wheelbarrows and hand labor will supplant the elevators used at Gold Hill. Capacity of the plant at a maximum will be 10 tons of lime fertilizer per hour.

Under the present contract the state will pay \$1.25 a ton for the raw lime. Freight to Salem is set at \$2 a ton, which brings the raw cost here to \$3.25. It is estimated that, with prison labor, the manufactured product will sell at farmers of this section than when the work was done at Gold Hill. A new building may be constructed very soon for these industries. partly, with a view to increasing the output of the shoe shop; eventually to make all the shoes needed at all the state institutions

A small tannery is also being considered, but large enough to furnish the leather for the shoes, and perhaps for harness and other uses at the state matitutions. It will be necessary to draw on
