PREPARE PLANS FOR DEMPSEY-WILLS GO

Chicago May Be Chosen if Boxing Is Legalized; Oil Men Back Match

CHICAGO, March 6.—(By Associated Press.)—The battleground for the world's heavy weight championship bout between Jack Dempsey and Harry Wills will be Chicago if negotiations started here today are carried through. The bout will be staged under the auspices of the Gotham Athletic Club provided the law legalizing boxing is passed at the April election.

Selection of Chicago as the scene of the battle was definitely announced tonight by Floyd Fitzsimmons, who holds the contract for Dempsey's and Wills' services, confirmed by the heavy-weight champion himself.

Dempsey also said that Sheldon Clark, Chicago sportsman and vice president of the Sinclair Oil company, was financially interested in staging the match. Dempsey was Clark's guest at a luncheon of the Chicago Athletic association yesterday at which more than one thousand Chicagoans were in attendance.
