examining physician at the women's prison at Archangel. There were 300 women and 90 children in the prison at that time. They were comfortable as far as food

was concerned, but being more or less ignorant they had slipped into living habits that were anything but healthful.

Their food consisted of black bread and fish. The babies ate gruel of the fish and black bread twice a day and had one meal of milk, diluted three or four times. Dr. Warner's first work was to insist that the women keep the windows open and let in the fresh air and to commandeer a certain portion of goat milk and cow's milk from the surrounding farms and feed the babies systematically on the milk.

Three days a week a clinic was held for the sick people, some surgery being accomplished. Most of the work of the Americans was along the line of relief.

"The night before we left," said

Dr. Warner, "the Russian girls met with us to discuss how they might carry on the club work. An executive committee of 10 girls was elected by the 290 girls to lead in the club work.

"There were 400 girls at the dock to see us off. They sang the Russian national anthem. Then they sang 'America the Beautiful.' The last thing we heard them say as our ship cleared was: 'America, we shall always call you our friend.'"
