National League of Women Voters to Open Convention Today in St. Louis
Mrs. Rex Stanford, president of the Salem branch of the National League of Women Voters will be one of two representatives from Oregon in attendance at national convention of the league which opens today in St. Louis, Mo.

From Washington, D. C., comes the following dispatch outlining the following:
Washington, D. C., April 10.—Women voters, from virtually every state in the country, are traveling toward St. Louis for the seventh annual convention of the National League of Women Voters.

The vanguard of the convention members of the board of directors, headed by Miss Belle Sherwin, recently arrived in St. Louis Friday night for the three days of executive sessions.

Principal topics slated for consideration are federal aid, taxation, election laws, women's rights, world peace and the world court, methods of amending the constitution, education, the legal status of women, immigration.

Chief of the proposals to be acted upon by delegates in addition to the adoption of the program, is a recommendation that the league hold biennial instead of annual conventions. The convention also will be asked to approve a plan to add more vice presidents to the list of officers.

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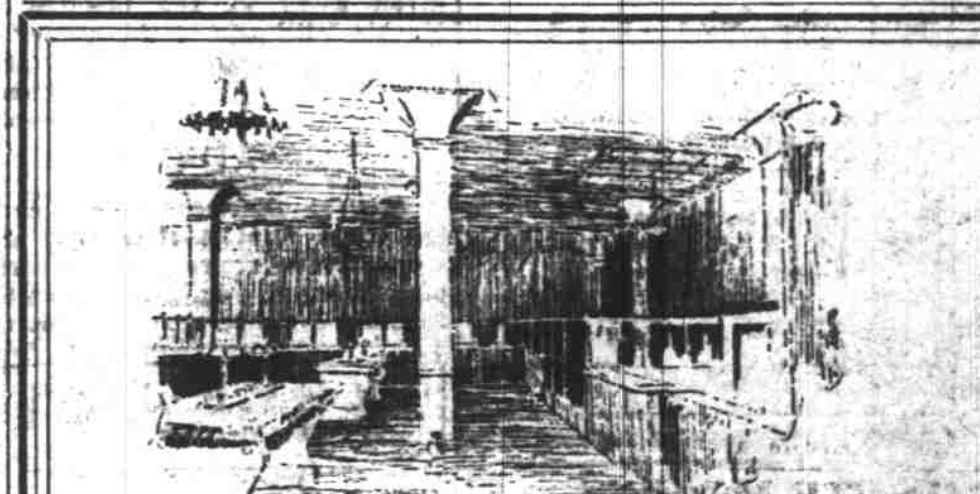
