EUGENE, May 6.—(Special.)—A big three-day junior tennis championship tournament on May 27, 28 and 29, including all the high schools in the south central Oregon district, was announced today by E. F. Abercrombie, tennis coach.

The university is combining with the city of Eugene to further a competitive sport, and since Eugene is the third tennis center in the state, Portland and Salem being the other two, it is hoped that this tournament will stimulate interest in the game.

The tournament will be held on the university's ten cement courts, which are considered the best in the northwest. The event is authorized by the United States Lawn Tennis association, and will be under the auspices of the physical education department.
