ALBANY, Or., May 18.—The American Legion athletic committee received a telegram from Al Reed, Reynolds' manager, stating that Reynolds has signed a contract to meet him Saturday by the Albany athletic committee. It was for Reynolds' signature upon this contract that the committee was waiting before making definite announcement that the match has been scheduled.

Receipt of the telegram materialized the dream not only of the principal party concerned, Robin Reed, but of the American Legion athletic committee and the Albany wrestling commission, both of which bodies have been cooperating for nearly two years with this match in view.

From the very beginning Robin Reed had his eyes upon the world championship belt. Soon after he began showing to local crowds it became apparent that his ambition was by no means an idle fancy.

Reed kept plugging away. So did the wrestling commission, and war veterans. Greater and greater success rewarded their efforts. This gradually altered the hope of a world title from mere possibility to great probability. Now the probability has become fact.

Moreover it must not be forgotten that the wrestling fans of Linn county and vicinity have made the epochal event possible. By their support they have been the means of attracting to Albany such men as Henry Jones here, and consequently of enabling Reed to prove that he is as good a professional wrestler as he was by comparison among the amateurs, where he surpassed all.
