Russian Village in De Mille Film Is Most Amazing Set in Production

Hollywood added another to its list of unusually large and amazing motion picture sets when Cecil De Mille's Russian village sets for "The Volga Boatman" was built. This is said to be one of the biggest technical achievements in motion pictures and on a par with the castles of "Robin Hood," the Egyptian city of "The Ten Commandments," and the circus maxims of "Ben Hur."

The village occupied more than one-quarter of the huge De Mille lot. Many of the houses were practical with four walls and so arranged that the walls could be lifted out and scene taken actually within the village, without the necessity of building separate sets.

"The Volga Boatman," which is now being presented at the Elsinore theater, was originally inspired by the song of that name, and it is an original story of Konrad Bergovici, the celebrated author. It was adapted for the screen by Lenora Coffee. The featured players include William Boyd, Eleanor Fair, Julia Faye, Theodore Kosloff and Victor Varconi.

LABOR SHORTAGE NOT SERIOUS, SAYS GRAM

Plenty of Pickers Available to Handle All Sorts of Crops in Marion County

One week ago there was a shortage of fruit pickers in the vicinity of Salem. This shortage has now been overcome and a well-balanced condition prevails at the present time. This was the substance of a report prepared here today by C. H. Gram, state labor commissioner.

Reports from Portland indicate that practically all orders for pickers have been supplied. Cool weather during the last few days has halted picking in many parts of Multnomah county, and there is a surplus of labor.

In Eugene there is a steady demand for pickers and other kinds of labor. Most of the calls for labor at Eugene have come from construction camps and is for railroad work.

Hillsboro reported that it could use a large number of strawberry pickers at the present time.

In the La Grande vicinity the supply and demand are about equal. Strawberry picking is in progress, with sufficient help available to handle the crop.

At Roseburg a surplus of labor exists at the present time. A record prune crop is expected in Douglas county this year, but the growers already have made arrangements for harvesters.

Hood River reported that the supply of labor equals the demand. Strawberry picking is in progress and cherry picking and apple thinning will soon get under way.

There is considerable activity in orchard work in the Medford district. Thinning also is under way. There is plenty of labor available to meet all demands.
