FOOL PROOF SAFETY DEVICE IS INVENTED

BALTIMORE, May 29.—(U. T. P. S.)—Go slow! This admonition seen at dangerous rail road crossings, curves and grades may soon be as superfluous as an ice manufacturing machine at the North Pole.

A new invention, patented by a Baltimore man, compels the automobile to slow down at such points no matter how hard the operator "steps on it" it is asserted.

The device controls the speed through ignition. The power of the automobile exceeding the speed limit set on the device (and any limit may be set) when crossing a magnet set in the roadbed is automatically cut off.
