Preacher, 75, Has His Own Creed; Walking From State to State

"I'm just preaching to do good in the world—I'm not trying to make converts," George W. Wilson, 75, an itinerant evangelist declared as he stopped over in Salem Wednesday on his "happy" tour of the United States.

"I'm trying to preach the gospel of Christ as I understand it, and I'm not knocking anybody or any organization," the old man said. "There is work for all of us to do."

"People in general are too busy with worldly pleasures to give much time to religion, and especially if one is on a street corner. The coming generation sneers more and more at the old-time

gospel and the one who attempts to preach on the street corners finds it discouraging and unpleasant."

SEA RESCUE ATTEMPTED

JAPANESE LINER ALONGSIDE BRITISH FREIGHTER

TOKYO, June 15.—(By Associated Press)—The Japanese destroyer Urakake in a wireless message to the navy department this afternoon said that an attempt would be made, late today to take off the crew of the British freighter City of Naples, as the storm in which the steamer ran aground near Miyake Island, off the Izu peninsula, was subsiding.

The destroyer's message said, about fifty members of the City of Naples crew could be seen huddled near her stern. The freighter is understood to have carried a crew of 61.

The Japanese steamer Chetoo Maru is standing by and is expected to join in the rescue attempt. The Chetoo Maru wireless to the Yokohama agents for the Ellerman line, owners of the ill-fated steamer, earlier today that only eight men could be seen on the City of Naples' decks.
