Solidly banking the hundred foot stairway leading to the sanctuary, thousands knelt in prayer before the with the speaking program which had been arranged to follow the rites of worship. So intent were the fervent

throngs upon approaching as nearly as possible to the altar that the masters of the ceremonies were forced to appeal to the multitude over the public address system to leave the field at once. In the sam/ manner, a warning was ed that the wooden elevation th the altar stood was endangered by the thousands which mounted the steps.

The crowds moved out in solmn order, only disappointed that they could not kneel individually before the altar crucifix to pour out their prayerful adoration of the eucharist. More than two hours after the mass ended twenty or thirty thousand people still were in the stands, some still ressing forward toward the altar. s early as five o'clock this morning, thousands were in their places in the stands, and at ten o'clock, the scheduled starting time, the sea of humanity which surged about all sides of the aiready packed stadium, blocked the path of the ecclesiastical procession for almost an hour, delaying the mass and taxing the efforts of the police to open a narrow lane for the prelates. As the priests, hishops and cardinals passed through the fervent multitudes outside the field. hundreds dropped to their knees for the blessing of the legate

Inside the procession was greeted first by an enthusiastic outburst of handclapping and then with reverent silence and prayer.




