

Salem Fishermen Plan to Invade Streams and Lakes on Fourth of July

NUMBER OF IDEAL SPOTS DESCRIBED

Fishing Trips of All Kinds Available to Residents of Salem District

Fishing trips for all kinds of fishermen will be available for the Fourth of July. For the man who doesn't mind a little bluing and rain, traveling to reach his fishing grounds, the Woodpecker creek, about nine miles above Detroit on the Santiam river, is suggested as the ideal spot. For the man who likes to take it easy, for the family along and find entertainment for them all, Devil's lake, at the coast, is offered as a choice location.

The Santiam, where the fish are biting best of any place near here right now, is reached by a good road, recently opened up, leading to Detroit. The road is via McManis and Mill City, and is about a 2 1/2 hour drive that far.

The nine miles between Detroit and Woodpecker creek must be covered on foot. At Woodpecker the trail divides, one branch going to Pamela lake and the other to Marion lake. Near there are big holes from which catches of "Dollies" are being taken daily with a spinner.

Fishes are said to be the best bait on the Santiam right now, with best results being obtained from blue upright flying Caddis and gray hackle.

Devil's lake offers an attraction in being good trout fishing, salmon trolling, clam digging, a good bathing beach, cottages, and the other features of a resort. Five fishing holes in the lake, two bays, all within seven miles, offer a variety of playgrounds to the angler.

Smooth roads run the entire distance of 110 miles, which can be covered in four hours of easy driving. The route is via Astoria, Sheridan and Astoria, then to the mouth of the Columbia, and then to the mouth of the Willamette.

Another alyan spot where the elusive trout is prevalent this season is the South Santiam, reached at Cascade by way of the Columbia and Albany. A store, camp grounds, cottages and good roads all go towards making this the pleasant destination for a weekend trip. Fly fishing is best here, with the caddis and gray hackle being used most successfully.

American Girls Defeat French Tennis Stars in Wimbledon Events

HUGE CROWD SEES HARD FOUGHT PLAY

Elizabeth Ryan and Mark Browne Receive Tremendous Applause in Game

WIMBLEDON, England, June 24.—(By Associated Press.)—Miss Suzanne Lenglen, six times Wimbledon doubles champion, carried the French colors to defeat with Miss Didi Votto in the ladies' singles tournament today before the spectacular team work at the net and the slicing stroke of the American team, Miss Elizabeth Ryan and Miss Mary K. Browne.

More than 17,000 spectators, among them the Duke of Devonshire, 3rd, applauded the bitterly contested match, replete with magnificent tennis.

Howard Kinsey, the only other American figuring in today's program, was out short by a hard rain, won his way to the fifth round of the men's singles, which apparently an excellent prospect of getting through to the semi-finals, where he is likely to meet Jacques Brugnon.

The demonstration that followed the notable victory of the American pair in today's star match was one of the most notable in Wimbledon's history. It was commented upon as one of unprecedented character, indicative of the popularity of the winning Americans, whose combined play at certain periods when the battle was uphill, was revelation to the enthusiastic watchers on the fairways.

Three set doubles which eliminated Miss Lenglen and her partner in the very first round, was 3-6, 9-7, 6-2. It was this match that the French champion refused to play yesterday.

Miss Lenglen, the prets association states, is fainting spell immediately after her defeat in the doubles and went direct from the Wimbledon grounds to a London throat specialist, but returning to her hotel she looked fit, but professed herself a little improved.

Statistics show that the Portland Cyclones, who come here to play the Senators Sunday afternoon, have outscored the locals 31 to 28, in the three games they have played against each other this season, although Salem has outlived them 38 to 37.

The closeness of these figures indicates the even ability between the two teams, so that Salem is conceded at least an even chance against the league leaders here Sunday.

Quinn tops the Salem hitters with an average of .328, while Reid is second with .276. Russell and Barham, the two pitchers, top the regulars in fielding with .900, errors chalked up against either Baird, Ridings, and Edwards have contributed the most misplays.

Barham, the Senator's star hurler, has opposed the northerners in all three of the previous contests, and is out for revenge against them. Rivalry between the members of the two teams is intense, so an interesting conflict is predicted.
