OUT OF DECLINE

ming trunks, was found floating in the Columbia river near here today. The body had been in the water nine or ten days.

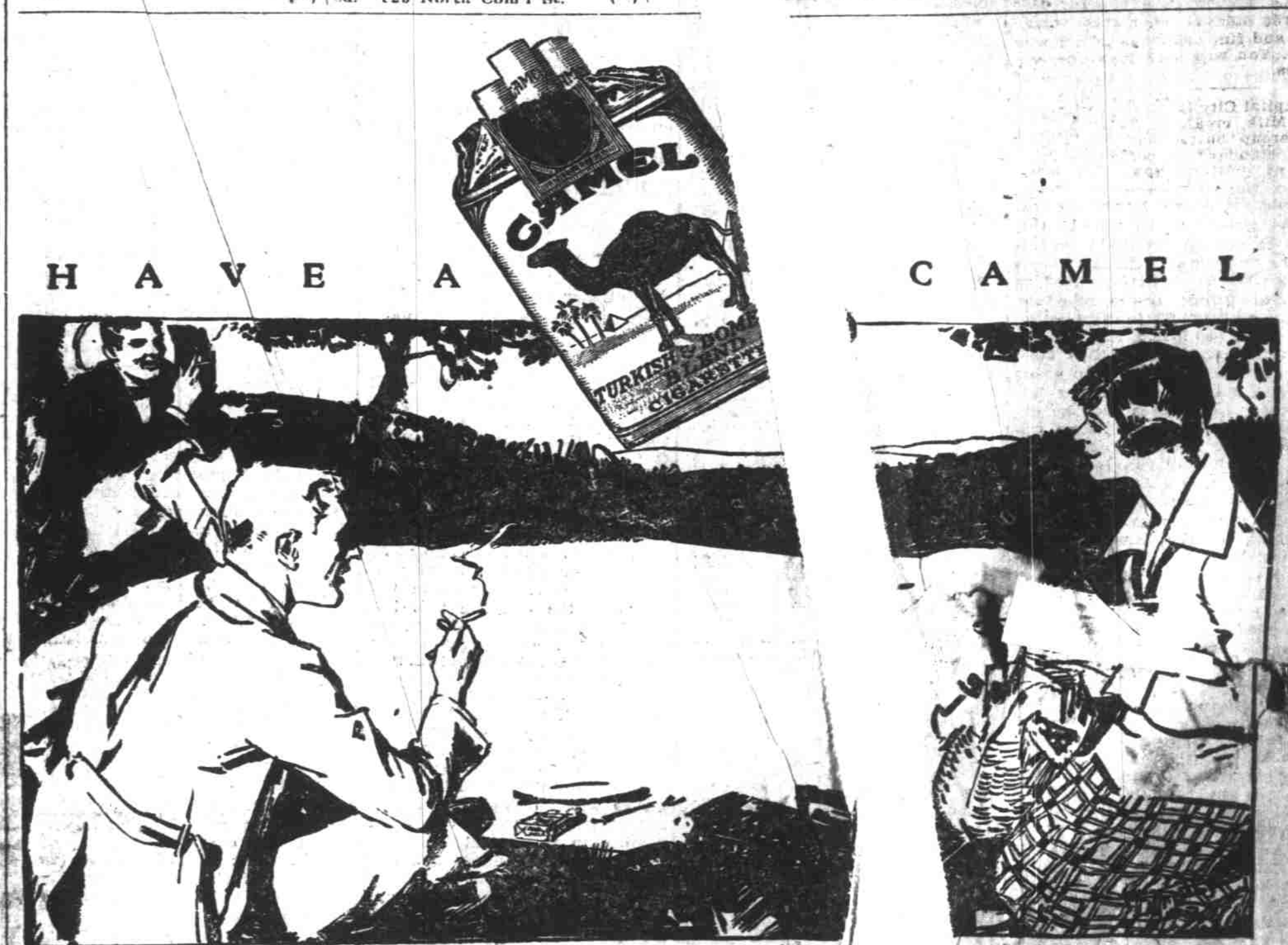
