Raise More Hogs So That You Can Raise More Corn and Sweet Clover—To Be a Successful Farmer, We Must Grow More Cultivated Crops in Order to Keep Down Our Noxious Weeds—More Than One Way to Figure Money Can Be Made by Raising Hogs.

Raise more hogs so that you can raise more corn and sweet clover. To be successful farmers, we must raise cultivated crops in order to keep down our noxious weeds. More than one way to figure money can be made by raising hogs.

Corn growers in the Salem district are getting all the way from 20 to 30 bushels per acre. Many of the grain growers are raising but 20 bushels of wheat to the acre. Corn in the west averages in price almost the same as wheat.

After a corn crop, the ground is ready for a good fall crop. Lime the field and raise sweet clover and keep as high as 15 brood sows

to the acre instead of two or three on our ordinary grasses.

In fields where hogs were fed by self-feeders and later planted to peppermint, we have noticed a gain of at least 20 pounds of oil to the acre and \$6 to the pound makes a gain of \$120.

The yield of wheat can be brought up from 20 to 30 bushels, or a gain of 30 bushels to the acre after a good crop of sweet clover.

There is more than one way to figure whether or not money can be made by raising hogs.

Is a Big Task

When it is realized that there are, at present, 62 boys' and girls' clubs, both regular and special, in the county and 602 club members, it is easier to understand the size of the task required by those directing this work. Each club member sends in an average of 10 cards for each project, and a final report. A little problem in arithmetic reveals that over 6,200 cards and reports must be handled by the county leader as a clerical detail.

During the state fair, all of the boys' and girls' club work is taken care of, either directly or indirectly by the county leader, with the assistance and cooperation of the club leaders. It is not known at present the exact number of the boys and girls on the farms of Marion county. The fact is, Marion county should have dozens of pig clubs, instead of only one.

"Smoki People" Prepare
For Yearly Snake Dance

PRESCOTT, Ariz., (AP)—Depicting the dances and ceremonies of northern Arizona Indians, the "Smoki People," a "tribe" composed of nearly 100 Prescott business men, will appear in their sixth annual performance at this community's "Way Out West" celebration.

The ancient, tribal and what are considered by some as pagan rites among the Indians are being discouraged. For this reason the Smokis have adopted the dances to preserve them for posterity.

The Smokis have gathered 200 or more snakes for use in the Snake Dance.

Begun in 1921 as a day of play for the community, the celebration since has been given over entirely to the presentation of a pageant program of a number of characteristic dances and ceremonies of northern Arizona Indians. The Smokis have a costume and paraphernalia department which possesses more than \$12,000 in outfits made in exact reproduction of the ceremonial garb and equipment of the various tribes.

Since 1921 ten dances and ceremonies have been studied, dramatized and reproduced, but the Smoki Snake Dance, as it is called, always constitutes the finale of the program. The basic purpose of the Smoki people is to erect a museum and to engage, when financed, in the exploration of all manner of antiquities of the southwest.

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JAPAN BARNYARD MILLET VERY GOOD

First Test This Year by
Many Dairymen of the
Oregon Coast Counties

Japanese barnyard millet by its ability to produce green feed in the dry weeks of the late summer in Oregon coast counties, gets its first test this year by many dairymen, reports the Oregon Agricultural College extension service. Some 40 demonstrations have been arranged by county agents in Clatsop, Tillamook, Lincoln, Douglas and Columbia counties.

An acre of the millet yielded 16 tons of green feed on the John Jacob Astor experiment station at Astoria. The average yield there since 1916, when the crop was first grown in an experimental way, is about 13 tons. Fed at the rate of 30 pounds per cow each day, an acre will carry 30 cows for one month. The crop is usually harvested between August 15 and September 15 when pastures are dry and succulence at a premium.

Spring freshening cows running on tideland pasture drop 40 to 45 per cent in production between June 1 and September 15, reports A. E. Engbreton, superintendent of the Astoria experiment station. Use of green feed reduces this drop about one-half. At current butterfat prices a herd of 15 cows given green feed between June 1 and December 31 produces about \$400 more income than the same herd will produce without green feed.

Probably a half dozen Clatsop county farmers grew this new crop in 1924. Another group of 25 Clatsop dairymen are trying it out this year, says County Agent F. W. McMindes. James Elliott, of Knappa, had 1 1/8 acre in 1925, which produced at the rate of 22 tons. This millet and 3-8 acre of vetch furnished green feed for a herd of 14 cows from July 1 to October 15. Mr. Elliott put his bed in very fine condition and scattered 20 loads of manure on the patch.

Motor Truck Library To
Take Books to Farmers

DES MOINES—(AP)—A library mounted on a motor truck will travel into the rural districts of Iowa this summer to demonstrate the educational value of county circulating libraries.

The Iowa Library association, which seeks to establish circulating libraries in each county now without library service, is sponsoring the demonstration.

The demonstration in each county will last about a week. In that time, the books will be moved to different parts of the county to fairs, private residences, and to meetings of farm bureaus, boys' and girls clubs, and schools. Books will in most cases be furnished by town libraries, and expenses paid by community clubs, farm bureaus and private citizens. The books on the library van will be lined with book cases facing outward and protected by glass windows to allow the maximum display.
