Mt. Angel college is situated one mile east of the city of Mt. Angel, on the Southern Pacific and Willamette Valley Southern railroads, 40 miles from Portland and 14 miles from Salem, with paved highways all the way, in different directions.

It was founded in 1887; chartered by the Oregon legislature. The seminary for training candidates for the priesthood was opened the following year. The buildings are modern and up to the minute. They are wonderfully attractive; solid as the rock of ages; fashioned of the native gray stone. There are hospital facilities, two dormitories, 50 private rooms for students, dining hall, museum, physical laboratories, biological laboratories--everything up to date.

Ambitious Plans
The faithful people behind Mt. Angel college and seminary have plans, to be worked out in the future, for a group of buildings that will render this one of the outstanding institutions of the United States, or of the whole world, and that will help to acculturate Salem as an educational center. This ambitious scheme will take millions, and years will be required to work it out.

The monumental structures already on that beautiful hill are an index of what may be ex-

pected concerning the larger proposed undertakings. These took years of patient and painstaking labor; building from the ground up, out of the solid rock of the mountain. But there was progress all along the patient and weary way; and it will be the same with this ambitious dream and major undertaking. It is a way those people have. They live in the present and look to and build for the future.

Things of the Present
The largest private printing plant west of Chicago is there; with a double supplement Hoe press. The newspapers printed there have nation-wide circulation. There is a large gymnasium and fine athletic field.

There is a four-year course leading to the degree of bachelor of arts; a two-year pre-medical course; a two-year pre-law course, and the same for engineering and journalism.

There is a junior college department, providing high school work.

There is an academic department, with the usual requirements and courses.

The institution has a thoroughly trained faculty of about 40.

There is a postoffice at the institution--St. Benedict, Oregon.

The opening of the coming school year will be September 13th and 14th for registration; formal opening September 20th.

All work of the academic and junior college departments at Mt. Angel is recognized by the Northwest Standardizing association, allowing students full credit in all colleges and universities for the work done at Mt. Angel.

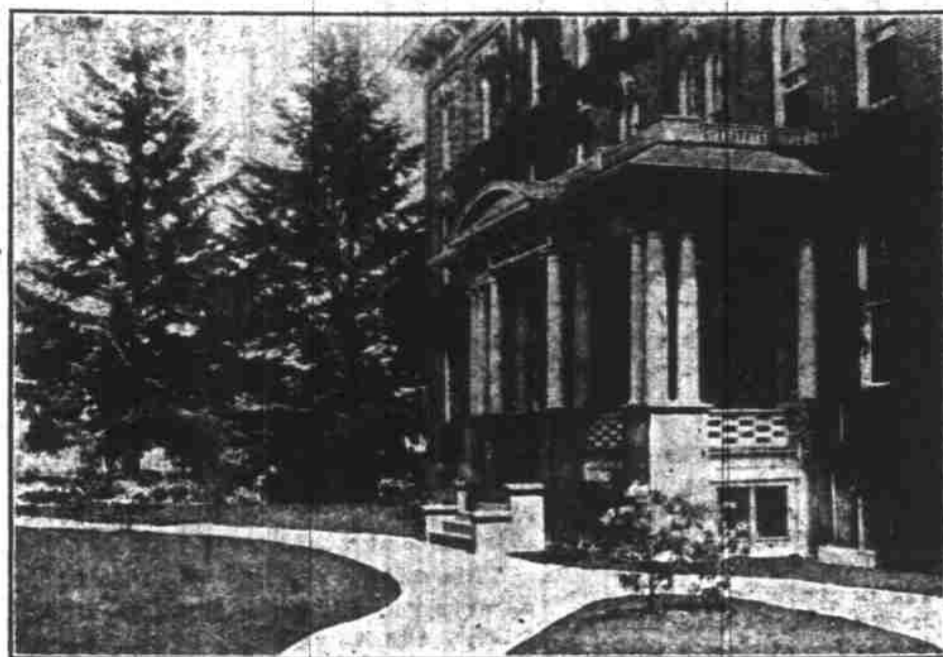

CAPITAL BUSINESS COLLEGE PIONEER

37 Years Old, and 36 Years Under Direction of the Present Owner

A group of Salem men were reminiscing a few days ago, and the conversation turned to speculation as to some of the oldest established lines of business in Salem which had been in business continuously for thirty years or more without a break. The consensus of opinion was that they ran about as follows:

If this enumeration is correct, there are perhaps only seven lines of business--only seven people or firms--now in business, which have been in business continuously in Salem longer than the Capital Business College.

The Capital Business College was established by A. P. Armstrong, then owner of the Portland Business College, Portland, Oregon, in the summer of 1889. Its first principal was E. L. Wiley, who was with the school one year and went from here to Chattanooga, Tennessee, where he was engaged in business college work for many years.

W. I. Staley, the present owner of the school, took charge in the summer of 1890, and has therefore seen thirty-six years of continuous service in the school business. This school is truly one of Salem's pioneer institutions, of which it is justly proud.

Thousands of pupils have passed through its courses and gone out to places in the business life of the northwest, where they may be found today, many of them in charge of, or connected with, some of the largest business institutions in the northwest.

The school, when first established, was located in what was then known as the old First National Bank building, at the corner of Commercial and Chemeketa streets. Later, it moved to a new location on Court street, over what is now the Dixie Bakery. Twelve years ago, quarters were taken in the second story of the Rodgers building at the corner of High and Ferry streets. Thus the school has occupied but three locations during the thirty-seven years of its existence. Next month, however, it will be moved to fine new quarters on the second floor of the new Chambers building at 388 North High street. These quarters are being ar-

range, commodious and modern. The class rooms are fully equipped for carrying out in detail all the activities of the modern school. The science laboratories afford adequate facilities for scientific study and research.

The academic department offers the regular four year high school course and is accredited to the University of Oregon.

The elementary department offers a thorough training in the work of the eight grades, preparatory to high school.

The department of music gives to students advanced training in piano, violin, cello, harp and voice. Students are received at all stages of advancement.

Registration for the fall term will be early in September. Both resident and day students are received.

The institution was founded in 1863.

Mr. Staley to suit his needs. The arrangement is ideal. An abundance of light is available for each room and the entire building will be heated by a modern steam plant. This location is ideal, quiet and close enough to the business part of the city to meet all business requirements.

From present indications Mr. Staley is of the opinion that the attendance next year will far exceed the attendance of last year. Inquiries are coming in daily from prospective pupils.

The same teaching force will be with the school the coming year that was with it last year. Mr. A. W. Cooper will have charge of the bookkeeping department, Mrs. Ora F. McIntyre the typewriting department, assisting in the shorthand department, and Mrs. Mona Yoder will have charge of English studies and assist in the shorthand department.

Mr. Staley plans to add some new lines of work in the near future, the exact extent of which has not yet been definitely determined. The same high standard of work which has characterized the school in the past will be continued and added to in the future.

For several years last past Mr. Staley has not been actively engaged in the school work, excepting in a supervisory capacity. He expects to close out the affairs of the Oregon Growers Cooperative association and Oregon Growers Packing corporation, of which he is now the manager, in a short time, when his entire attention will be given over to the school duties.

Pupils who enroll in this school may be assured of finding a real school home where the teachers are skilled and painstaking and take a personal interest in the welfare of each pupil.

Oregon Telegraph School Has Fine Standing With the Big Concerns

Young men or young women who have a craving for travel will find in the vocation of telegraph or radio operator an opportunity to satisfy their ambition.

Two students of the Railway Telegraph and Radio Institute, Railway Exchange building, Portland, Oregon, are now operating in Alabama--one of them with the Seaboard Air Line and the other with the Atlantic Coast line. Two other students are now in Florida operating for the Western Union Telegraph company. Opportunities for advancement are numerous, and often these promotions include transfer to far distant fields, even to foreign countries sometimes.

Mr. J. G. Stack, the manager of this school, the only exclusive telegraph school in the northwest, has been training telegraph operators since 1903. He is particularly well qualified for this work, for his experience covers a period of 22 years filling posts of great importance in the organizations in which he was employed. He was at various times operator, traffic chief, wire chief, and chief operator for the Western Union Telegraph company. For over two years during the war he was chief operator at Fort Riley and Camp Funston. His connection with the prominent railroads of the south, west and middle west reads like a romance, and his appointment as teacher in the Western Union Telegraph company school at Salina, Kansas, and the State Technical Institute of Pocatello, Idaho, evidences his ability as an instructor.

Though the fact is not generally known, it is nevertheless claimed that some of the most prominent men in the world were once telegraphers. Among them are numbered such celebrities as Andrew Carnegie, Frank A. Munsey, the great publisher, Thomas A. Edison, and Richard W. Sears, the founder of Sears, Roebuck and company.

In recognition and appreciation of the service this school is rendering the railroads of this
